INSTRUCTIONS FOR TAKING THE EXAMINATIONS

1. Print your name, address, and Student Number clearly in the space provided. Be sure to use the same name and spelling each time.
2. The answer for each question will be found in the lesson or in the Bible references. You may look at the lesson and the Bible as you answer these questions.
3. There is only one correct answer for each question. In most cases **ONE WORD** will answer the question. Some questions may require two or three words to complete the answer, if a full name or title is called for. Print the **ONE WORD** (or title) which answers the question clearly *on the line* beside the question. You do not need extra space. You are **NOT** to write a sentence in answering any question. Write only the **ONE WORD** which gives the answer. Questions may be asked in several different forms: (1) a direct question with a one word answer; (2) one word left out of a quotation, to be written on the line beside the question (3) a question which can be answered yes or no. Study the examples given below until you understand clearly how you should answer.

EXAMPLE:

_____ Genesis _____ 1. What is the name of the first book of the Bible?

We know that the answer is **GENESIS**. Therefore print the word **GENESIS** on the line beside the question.

EXAMPLE:

_____ Genesis _____ 2. The name of the first book of the Bible is_____.

We know that the word which is left out is **GENESIS**; therefore print the word **GENESIS** on the line beside the question, **NOT** in the blank within the question.

EXAMPLE:

 No 3. Is the name of the first book of the Bible Exodus?

We know that the answer is NO. Therefore print the word NO on the line beside the question.

4. As you do these examinations, read each question carefully, think clearly, and take enough time so that you can do your best. Do not guess. Check the book of lessons or the Bible and be sure that your answer is correct.

5. YOU MUST HAVE DONE THE FOLLOWING BEFORE YOUR EXAMINATIONS WILL BE GRADED:

- (a) You must have read all the scripture references in each lesson.
- (b) You must have memorised the memory verse in each lesson.

This will enable you to answer questions 1 and 2 correctly and truthfully.

6. IMPORTANT ____ When you have completed your examinations for ALL THREE COURSES, mail them to us.

7. IMPORTANT ____ Be sure that you have the required postage on the envelope. No postage-due envelopes will be received by the Bible Way Correspondence School.
