When Jesus finished speaking, he said to Simon, "Let us go fishing."


Simon said, "Last night we fished the whole night and we did not catch one fish. But I'll go again if you want me to."

When they saw the crowd of people, they said, "What shall we do? We cannot get to Jesus."


