DAY 1: THE HUSBAND IS THE HEAD OF THE WIFE

1 Corinthians 11:2-16

1. Welcome to a new week of lessons. You are now halfway through this study of 1 Corinthians.

From 1 Corinthians 10:31, how should Christians do all things? _____

Whom did Paul try to be like in all things? _____

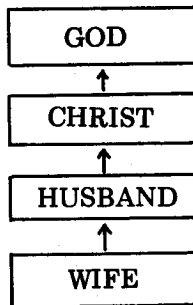
2. We should do all things in a way that brings glory to God. Paul tried to be just like Christ. And that is what we should do. When we do this, we will give others a good example to follow.

Today we want to learn about God's plan in the church. God's plan is: first God, then Christ, then man, then woman. God is the head of Christ. But Christ is equal with God. In the same way, a husband is head of the wife. But husbands and wives are equal before God. Let us learn it this way:

- (1) The husband is the head of his wife.
- (2) Man and woman are equal before God.

Take your Bible now and read 1 Corinthians 11:3 to 12.

3. God always has a plan. He had a plan when he made the world. He has a plan for the world now. He has a plan for the church. Let us look at it this way:



1 Corinthians 11:3:

But I want you to understand that the head of every man is Christ, the head of a woman is her husband, and the head of Christ is God.

Who is the head of man? _____

Who is the head of woman? _____

4. Christ is the head of man. The husband is the head of his wife. But this verse also tells us about Christ and God. We know that Jesus is God. Jesus is equal with God. This is what Paul wrote in Philippians. Jesus did not have to seek after the position of God. He is God.

Philippians 2:5:

though he (Jesus) was in the form of God, did not count equality with God a thing to be grasped.

Jesus is equal with God. But who is the head of Jesus? _____

5. God is the head of Jesus. Jesus is the Son of God. This means that he is God. But he was obedient to his Father. Jesus did the work that his Father wanted him to do.

John 14:9:

. . . he who has seen me (Jesus) has seen the Father. . . . But I do as the Father has commanded me. So that the world may know that I love the Father.

Jesus obeyed God because God is his head. Did Jesus have to try to become equal with God? _____

6. Jesus did not try to become equal with God. He is equal with God. Jesus is God. Jesus lived before the world began. Jesus helped to create the world.

Who is the head of Christ? _____

7. God is the head of Christ. Even though Jesus is God, he still obeyed his Father. Christ is equal with God. This is an example for us to follow. It teaches us something about husbands and wives.

- (1) The husband is the head of his wife.
- (2) Man and woman are equal before God.

Who is the head of the man? _____

8. From the verses we see that Christ is the head of the man. Man must obey Christ. He must follow the teachings of Jesus. Man must follow the example of Jesus.

Ephesians 5:23, 25:

For the husband is the head of the wife as Christ is the head of the church, his body, and is himself its Saviour Husbands love your wives, as Christ loved the church and gave himself up for her.

Of whom is the husband the head? _____

9. He is head of his wife. But he is to be head in the same way that Christ is head of the church. What kind of head is Christ? Christ gave himself for the church. He died for the church. In the same way, the head of a wife should give himself for the wife.

Who is head of the wife? _____

10. The husband is head of the wife. This is the first thing we are learning. It is the man who has been given the work of caring for the wife. He is the leader. But this does not mean the husband can treat his wife as a servant. It does not mean he can treat a woman as a lower person. It means that the head must take care of his wife. The head must make the big decisions in the home. The head must take care of the needs of the home.

Whose plan is it that the husband is head of the wife? _____

11. This is God's plan. Let us remember that God and Christ are equal. Jesus is God. But God is the head of Christ. In the same way, man and woman are equal. Man and woman depend on each other.

1 Corinthians 11:11-12:

Nevertheless, in the Lord woman is not independent of man nor man of woman; for as woman was made from man, so man is now born of woman. And all things are from God.

God is the head of Christ, but Christ is equal with God. This tells us two things about man and woman. What is the first thing?

(1) _____

(2) Man and woman are equal before God.

12. The first thing is that the husband is head of the wife. Man has the work of caring for the needs of his wife. He must work for his family and home. As the head, he must be willing to give himself for his wife. If the husband is a good head, it will be easy for his wife to obey him.

God is the head of Christ, but they are equal. What is the second thing this teaches us about man and woman?

(1) The husband is the head of the wife.

(2) _____

13. The second thing is that man and woman are equal. God loves men. God loves women. He wants people of two kinds. They have different places to fill. They have different work. But they are equal before God.

Jakobe went to borrow Musa's bicycle. Musa was not at home, but his wife was there. Musa's wife told Jakobe, "I know that my husband may agree to lend his bicycle. But he is gone now. I cannot give the bicycle to you when he is gone. It is my husband who makes these decisions in our home. Let us wait until he comes."

Why did Musa make the big decisions in his home? _____

14. Musa made the big decisions because he was head of his home. His wife knew this. She did not make the decisions, even when Musa was away. But Musa's wife helped him in making decisions. When Musa came home, his wife told him about Jakobe. She reminded him that Jakobe was a good Christian. She knew he would be careful with the bicycle. Musa listened to his wife's advice. He made the decision. He decided to lend the bicycle to Jakobe.

Do you think Musa thought of his wife as equal to him? _____

15. We will talk about this in class. I believe Musa thought of his wife as equal. Musa made the decisions. But he knew that his wife was important. He knew that she could help him. In 1 Corinthians we read that the first woman was taken from the side of man. This shows that the woman depended on the man. But since that time, every man has come from the body of a woman. This shows that man also depends on woman.

God is the head of Christ, but Christ is equal with God. This teaches us two things about man and woman. Write the first.

(1) _____

(2) Man and woman are equal before God.

16. First it teaches that the husband is the head of his wife. The husband is the head of the wife as Christ is head of the church. Men must follow the example of Jesus. Jesus was obedient to his head. Husbands must be obedient to their head, who is Christ.

God is the head of Christ, but Christ is equal with God. What is the second thing this teaches us about man and woman?

17. We learn that man and woman are equal before God. When people know their places with each other and God, they live in love. They do things that show respect. In 1 Corinthians 11, we read the ways in which the Corinthians showed respect to their heads. The women covered their heads when they went to church. The men did not cover their heads. They also showed respect by having the women's hair longer than the men's.

Many people do not understand the things in this lesson. Perhaps people in your church do not understand. Prepare a sermon to preach about these things. Write your thoughts on another paper.

WEEK 6:

DAY 2: THE LORD'S TABLE REMINDS US OF THE LORD'S DEATH

1 Corinthians 11:17-26

1. God is the head of Christ. But Christ is equal with God. What does this teach us about man and woman?

2. Yesterday we learned that the husband is the head of the wife. We also learned that man and woman are equal before God.

Today we want to study verses which tell us about the Lord's table. These are important verses. They tell us something we should do in our churches. There are two big reasons why we should have the Lord's table.

(1) To help us remember the Lord's death.

(2) To help us tell sinners about the Lord's death.

Stop now and read 1 Corinthians 11:20 to 26 in your Bible.

3. Paul helped the Corinthians to start having the Lord's table. But they had not understood well. They were not showing respect to God in their meeting. They did not understand what the Lord's table was for. Paul had to explain to them again how the Lord's table was started and what it was for.

When Jesus was on earth, he did many things. He taught people. He healed people. He gave people a good example to follow. But he did something more important than these.

What do you think is the most important thing Jesus did? _____

4. The Bible says that the big reason Jesus came was to die for our sins. This is the most important thing he did.

Before Jesus died on the cross, he ate a meal with his disciples. We read about this meal in Luke 22. At the meal, they talked about the time when the people of Israel left Egypt. All the Jewish people remembered how God saved them out of Egypt. Jesus wanted to keep this time with his disciples. It was at this meal that he started the Lord's table.

Luke 22:8:

So Jesus sent Peter and John, saying, "Go and prepare the passover for us, that we may eat it."

From this verse, what is the name of the special meal Jesus ate with the disciples?

5. This meal was called the passover. The passover was a Jewish holiday. It was a time when all the Jews remembered how God saved them out of Egypt. Jesus was a Jew. He ate this meal with his disciples. But at this meal, Jesus told the disciples about his coming death. He told them how he would die for the sins of the world.

Many countries have special days to remember what happened to their people. What special days do you have for this?

6. It is good for us to remember what has happened in the past. It is good to remember the history of our people. At the passover, the Jews remembered how the angel of death passed over their houses and saved them from Egypt. They remembered how they got their freedom. But at this passover, Jesus told the disciples a new thing which was coming.

When Jesus ate the passover with the disciples, what new thing did he say would happen?

7. Jesus said that he would die. At this time, he gave the disciples some bread to eat and some wine to drink. He said that the bread stands for his body and the wine stands for his blood.

Jesus said that his followers should continue to take bread and wine in this special way. This should be done in the church today. We should eat some bread. We should drink from a cup. We call this the Lord's table or the Lord's supper. Sometimes we call it communion or the breaking of bread.

When we have the Lord's table, what does this help us to remember?

8. This helps us to remember the death of Jesus. Jesus died on the cross for us. He died for our sins. He took our place because we are sinful. We should be punished. But Jesus died and was punished for us. Paul told the Corinthians what Jesus did to help us remember this.

1 Corinthians 11:24-25:

And when he had given thanks, he broke it (the bread), and said, "This is my body which is (broken) for you. Do this in remembrance of me." In the same way also the cup, after supper, saying, "This cup is the new covenant (or agreement) in my blood. Do this, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of me."

What can we have in church to help us remember the death of Jesus?

9. We can have the Lord's table. At the Lord's table we eat some bread. This stands for the body of Jesus that was broken for us. We give thanks to God for sending his Son. Then we drink from a cup. This stands for the blood of Jesus. We give thanks to God for the blood which was shed for us. Jesus was willing to die for our sins.

There are two big reasons why we have the Lord's table. Write the first. Then read the second.

(2) To help us tell sinners about the death of Jesus.

10. The first reason is to help us remember that Jesus died for our sins. This is something we know. But sometimes we forget to thank God for sending his Son to die. The Lord's table is a way to help us remember to thank God.

The other reason is that it helps us to tell sinners about Jesus.

1 Corinthians 11:26:

For as often as you eat this bread and drink the cup, you proclaim (or tell) the Lord's death until he comes.

From this verse, what is one way to tell sinners about the death of Jesus?

11. We can do this by having the Lord's table. We can tell this to sinners. Sinners need to know about this. They need to be saved. Sinners do not eat from the Lord's table. But sometimes they are in church when Christians have the Lord's table.

What can we tell sinners when we have the Lord's table? _____

12. We can tell them about the death of Jesus. Jesus died for them. He was punished for them. The Lord's table tells people about this if it is done in the right way. Sometimes the Corinthians did not eat the Lord's table in the right way. Paul had to speak hard words to the Corinthians about this. Using the Lord's table in the wrong way brings much shame on the church. We need to be careful about this.

Whom can Christians tell about the death of Jesus by having the Lord's table?

13. We can tell sinners about the death of Jesus by having the Lord's table. This is the second big reason why we have it. It is a way to witness. It is a way to bring sinners to Jesus. We should be careful when sinners ask us about the Lord's table. We should explain that the death of Jesus is very important. It is the most important thing we believe. Because Jesus died, we can be saved.

From what book of the Bible are we studying about the Lord's table?

14. We are studying this from 1 Corinthians. It is in chapter 11. Many shepherds read these verses when they have the Lord's table in church. Perhaps you can do this if you are chosen to care for the Lord's table.

What is the second reason why we have the Lord's table in church?

15. It helps us tell sinners about the death of Jesus. Many people do not know why Jesus died. They are sinners. They need to be saved. When we have the Lord's table, we can take time to explain to them why Jesus died.

What is the first reason why we have the Lord's table? _____

16. The first reason is to help Christians remember the Lord's death.

What is the second reason why we have the Lord's table? _____

17. The second reason is to help us tell sinners about the Lord's death. Tendai is the shepherd of a church. Sometimes he has many Christians at the meeting when he has the Lord's table. He helps the Christians remember that Jesus died for them. He helps the people give thanks for this.

DAY 3: THE BREAD AND CUP STAND FOR HIS BODY AND BLOOD

1 Corinthians 11:17-26

1. Yesterday we learned that there are two big reasons why we have the Lord's table.

What are they?

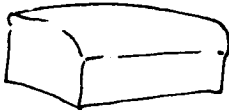

2. The Lord's table helps us remember the death of Jesus. It also helps us tell sinners about the death of Jesus. Some people ask us why we have the Lord's table in church. They ask why we eat bread and drink from a cup. We will learn about these today.

(1) The bread we eat stands for the body of Christ.

(2) The cup stands for the blood of the new agreement.



1 Corinthians 11:23-24:

... the Lord Jesus on the night when he was betrayed took bread, and when he had given thanks, he broke it, and said, "This is my body which is for you. Do this in remembrance of me."

For whom was the body of Jesus broken? _____

3. The body of Jesus was broken for us. It was for you and for me. When Jesus lived on earth, he had a body. His body was like the bodies of all men. When he died on the cross, his body was beaten. They drove nails into his body. They pierced him with a spear. They killed Jesus on the cross.

What stands for the body of Jesus at the Lord's table? _____

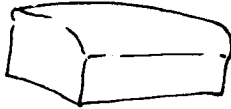
4. When we have the Lord's table, we use bread. Jesus talked about bread. Bread is something that is common. Bread gives life. Jesus said that he is the bread for our spiritual lives. As bread gives strength to our bodies, so Jesus gives strength for our spirits.

John 6:35:

I (Jesus) am the bread of life.

At the Lord's table, what does the bread stand for? _____

5.



Bread stands for the body of Jesus. When believers eat the bread, they should remember what happened to the body of Jesus. The bread helps us to remember. When we buy bread, we get a big piece. But when we eat it, we break it into smaller pieces. This is what Jesus did when he gave the bread to the disciples.

Bread stands for the body of Jesus. What happened to the body of Jesus on the cross?

6. The body of Jesus was broken. It was pierced and beaten. It is true that his bones were not broken. But the soldiers put a spear into his side. They put a crown of thorns on his head. They beat him. They spat on him. Blood came from the body of Jesus.

What stands for the body of Jesus at the Lord's table? _____

7. We use bread to stand for the body of Jesus which was broken for us. When we have bread in our homes, we share it with all the family. We have fellowship when we eat.

It is like this when we eat bread to remember the Lord's death. We share the bread. We have fellowship with other Christians. We have fellowship with God. This time brings us close together.

What do we call the time when Christians eat bread to remember the death of Jesus?

8. We call this the Lord's table. We eat bread. This stands for the body of Jesus. It was broken for us. Jesus died so we could be saved from our sins.

1 Corinthians 11:25:

In the same way also the cup, after supper, saying, "This cup is the new covenant (or agreement) in my blood. Do this, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of me."

Jesus gave the disciples bread. What other thing did he give them? _____



9. Jesus gave them a cup. He said that the cup stands for the new agreement which he was making. We read about the old agreement in the Old Testament. This agreement was made with the blood of animals. When Jesus came he made a new agreement with us.

What did Jesus use to make a new agreement? _____

10. He used his blood to make this new agreement. We know that some of our fathers made agreements. They spoke many words. Then they used blood to make the agreements strong. Jesus made a new agreement. He agreed to give us life and blessing. We must repent and accept Jesus as our Saviour.

At the Lord's table, what do we use that stands for the blood of Jesus?

11. We use a cup with wine to remember that Jesus gave his blood. When Jesus died he gave us his blood. This means that he gave us his life.

Leviticus 17:11:

For the life of the flesh is in the blood.

In the Old Testament we read about the old agreement. What did Jesus make with his blood when he died on the cross?

12. Jesus made a new agreement. The old agreement was that God would be the God of the people of Israel. God wanted them to be his children. The old agreement meant that people had to follow the laws of God. They had to make many sacrifices.

Hebrews 8:8, 13:

The days will come, says the Lord, when I will establish a new covenant. . . . In speaking of a new covenant he treats the first as obsolete (or not used any more) and what is becoming obsolete and growing old is ready to vanish (or pass) away.

What did Jesus use to make the new agreement? _____

13. Jesus used his blood to make this agreement. He died on the cross. The soldiers put nails into his hands and feet. They put a spear into his side. Jesus died to make a new agreement. God has made us a promise. If we receive Jesus, he will save us from our sins. This is the new agreement he made.

What do we use at the Lord's table to stand for the blood of the new agreement?

14. We use a cup of wine. When Jesus was showing this to his disciples, he gave them a cup to drink from. They all drank together.

What does the cup stand for? _____

15. The cup stands for the blood of the new agreement. God made a new agreement with his people. He made this agreement strong with the blood of Jesus.

It is important that all Christians have the Lord's table sometimes in church. If you are chosen by your church to lead this meeting, you can follow the example of Jesus. You can do what he did. Here are things you should do.

Take bread.

Thank God that Jesus died for our sins.

Break the bread and give it to the believers to eat.

Take a cup with something to drink.

Thank God for the blood of the new agreement.

Share the cup with the believers.

You must help the believers thank and praise God at this time. The shepherd should help his people do this.

From yesterday's lesson, write two big reasons why we should have the Lord's table.

WEEK 6:

DAY 4: WE MUST EXAMINE OURSELVES FOR THE LORD'S TABLE

1 Corinthians 11:27-34

1. We have been seeing some important things about the Lord's table. We have learned that the shepherd should help the Christians thank God for Jesus. He should also help sinners understand that Jesus died for them.

At the Lord's table, what does the bread stand for? _____

What does the cup stand for? _____

2. The bread stands for the body of Jesus. The cup stands for the blood of the new agreement. There are many things that the shepherd should do at the Lord's table. Today we will learn two things he should help the believers do.

- (1) Christians should examine themselves.
- (2) They should straighten their lives.

Take your Bible now and read 1 Corinthians 11:27-34.

What kind of people should eat at the Lord's table? Christians or sinners?

3. This is something for Christians. Only those who have received Jesus should eat at the Lord's table. They should do it carefully. It is a big thing to come to the Lord's table. Those who come carelessly bring judgment upon themselves.

1 Corinthians 11:28:

Let a man examine (or look carefully at) himself, and so eat of the bread and drink of the cup.

What does this verse tell us to do before we eat the bread and drink the cup?

4. We should examine ourselves. This means we must look at ourselves carefully.

Odongo wanted to buy a new ox. He went to the man who owned the ox. He talked about the ox and about the money. But Odongo had some questions. He wanted to see the size of the ox. He wanted to see if it was strong and healthy. He wanted to see if it could plough well. Odongo went to see the ox itself. He looked at it very carefully.

What do we say Odongo did when he looked carefully at the ox?

5. Odongo examined the ox. This is what we must do. We must examine ourselves. We must look carefully at our lives. We must see if there is sin there. We must see if there are things in our hearts which should not be there. Perhaps we will find jealousy. Perhaps we will remember that we have told lies. Perhaps we will remember that we have spoken bad things about a brother.

When must believers examine themselves? _____

6. We must do this before going to the Lord's table. We must do it before we eat the bread or drink from the cup. The Lord's table is an important time for Christians. It is a time to thank Jesus for dying on the cross. It is not a time to be careless. If we are careless we bring shame on Christ.

1 Corinthians 11:27:

Whoever, therefore, eats the bread or drinks the cup of the Lord in an unworthy manner (or careless way) will be guilty of profaning (or bringing shame on) the body and blood of the Lord.

Who should examine himself at the Lord's table? _____

7. This is something that each Christian at the Lord's table should do. This is not something that the shepherd does for the people. Each person must do this for himself.

What should all believers do before they eat at the Lord's table?

8. All believers should examine themselves before they take from the Lord's table. Each person should look to see if there is sin in his life. These verses tell us why this is important.

1 Corinthians 11:27, 29-30:

Whoever, therefore, eats the bread or drinks the cup of the Lord in an unworthy manner will be guilty of profaning the body and blood of the Lord. . . . For any one who eats and drinks without discerning the body eats and drinks judgment upon himself. That is why many of you are weak and ill, and some have died.

From these verses, what happened when the Corinthians ate at the Lord's table in the wrong way?

9. The verses say that some became weak and ill and some died. They brought judgment on themselves. This shows us that we must be careful to have the Lord's table in the right way.

What should Christians do before eating at the Lord's table? _____

10. We should examine ourselves. Perhaps we will find sin in our hearts. Then what should we do? We should confess it to God and make it right with others. We should straighten our lives.

1 Corinthians 11:31:

But if we judged ourselves truly, we should not be judged.

From this verse, how can we keep from being judged? _____

11. We should judge ourselves. To judge ourselves means to do something about what we see in our lives.

Mutyaba was a Christian. One Sunday at church, they had the Lord's table. Before Mutyaba took the bread and the cup, he examined his life. He remembered that he had spoken angry words to another brother. Mutyaba confessed this to God. He went to his brother and confessed his sin. He said that he was wrong and was sorry.

When Mutyaba examined his life, he found sin. Then he judged his sin. He confessed it to God. He went to his brother and confessed his sin. He straightened his life.

From this lesson, when is one important time to straighten our lives? _____

12. This is what we should do before we eat at the Lord's table. When we come to the Lord's table, we should first examine ourselves. If we see something that is sinful, we should do something else.

What is it? _____

13. We should straighten our lives. We should confess it to God and make it right with our brother.

Juma was in church when the shepherd was serving the Lord's table. Before he took the bread and the cup, he examined his life. When he did this, he knew he had done some wrong things.

What should Juma do? _____

14. Perhaps you said that Juma should refuse the bread and the cup. This is only partly right. Juma should straighten his life. God wants Juma to be able to take from the Lord's table. Juma is a believer. He should judge himself. He should do something about his sin. He should confess it to God. Then he should make the wrong things right with others.

If Juma straightens his life in this way, do you think he should take from the Lord's table?

15. He should take from the Lord's table. God does not want to keep us away from the Lord's table. He wants us to come. But before we come we must do something. We must examine ourselves.

If a Christian finds sin in his life before taking from the Lord's table, what should he do?

16. He must straighten his life. He must judge himself. If we do not judge ourselves, then God will judge us. This is what happened at Corinth. Some people were not careful. Then they became sick. Some died. If we sin, we should confess it. We should ask God to forgive us. God will do this. If we have sinned against a brother in the church, we should go to him and ask him to forgive. Then we can eat and drink with the others.

Do you think these things are done easily? _____

17. These things are difficult. They take time. If the shepherd hurries over these things, then the people will be careless. They will not do what they should. We must prepare for the Lord's table carefully and slowly. Sometimes the shepherd can give time right in the meeting for people to pray. He can give time for them to confess to each other.

What should a Christian do before eating at the Lord's table? _____

If a Christian finds sin in his life before taking from the Lord's table, what should he do?

18. Christians should examine themselves at this time. If they find sin in their lives they should straighten their lives. They should do this by confessing to God and to others. This takes time. Our people need to learn to do these things. It is the work of the shepherd to help people do these things in the right way.

Let us say that a person in your church refuses to eat at the Lord's table. He says that someone in the church has done wrong to him. He says that there is trouble between him and that person. What can you tell him to do?

19. We will talk about this together in class.
