It is good to have meetings and to visit. We must use these ways to do evangelism. But we cannot have meetings all the time. We cannot be visiting all the time. We know that we must spend much time working. We must get food and clothes and take care of our families.

But you can do evangelism even while you are working. Through your work is a good way to do evangelism. You meet people when you are working. If you work in a store, you meet people who come to buy. If you work in an office you see those who work with you. If you farm, you see people walking by. If you work in a school you see children and teachers.

When you do your daily work, you see people and they see you. They know how you live. Because you are a Christian, they see how a Christian lives. They see how being a Christian helps you.

Another way to do evangelism is through written words. Let us think of how God gave His words to men. We can say that first He spoke to men. But He did not stop there. He told men to write down His words. In this way His words could be kept well.

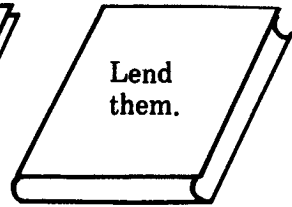
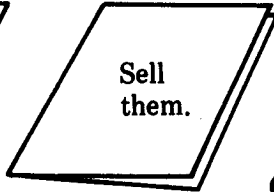
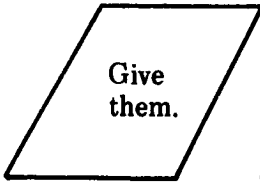
It is good to give people written words about God. When we give papers, people can keep the words. They can read them again and again. The words do not change. They do not go away.

Some papers you can just give away. They are small. They do not cost much. You can buy many and give them freely to people. If you do not know where to get these papers, ask your pastor or other church leader to help you.

Sometimes people read papers and books more carefully if they buy them. When a paper is given to them, they do not care. But if they have paid money for it, they will read it.

Because of this, some people like to sell Christian papers. This is their way of doing evangelism. They go to people's houses. Or they stand on the street of a city. They try to sell Christian papers.

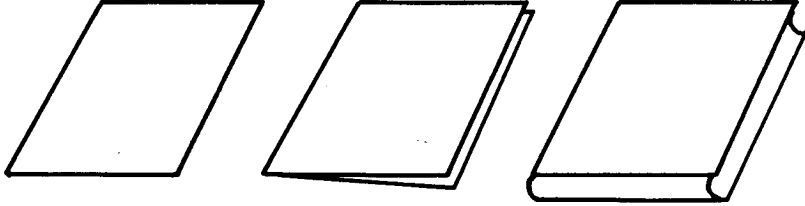

I once read the true story of a man who did evangelism. The man had a neighbour who was not a Christian. One day he went to visit him and give him a paper. He knocked at the door. At first the neighbour did not come. When he came, he was angry. He took the paper, but he refused to talk with the Christian.

Later the Christian went to visit him again. This time the neighbour invited him inside. He thanked him for coming. He showed him a rope. He said,

“When you came to see me on that day, I was holding this rope. I was ready to hang myself. My sins were troubling me so much I wanted to die. But when you came, I put the rope down. I was angry with you, but I decided to read your paper. In it I read how God would forgive me. I have become a Christian.”

The people who are kept together have many needs. They have needs of the body. We Christians must help them with these needs. They also have needs of the spirit. They need new life in Christ. We must tell them how to receive Christ.

Street meetings are hard work. But look what happened to a friend of mine. He is Mr. Mack Mabitsela of Tzaneen, South Africa. Mack says, "One day I felt God calling me to start a street meeting. I was afraid, but on Sunday I went to a place near a beer hall. There I sang a song. I prayed loudly and then preached. As I was getting into my car, two young men came running. They wanted to know what I was doing. I told them I was having a street meeting.

"On the following Sunday I found the two young men waiting for me. After I preached, they wanted to receive Christ. On the fourth Sunday, a policeman came. At the end of the meeting he too received Christ.

"After a year and a half, there were 30 of us meeting by the street. The city of Tzaneen promised to build a hall for us to meet in."

Jesus told the disciples to begin at home in Jerusalem. Then he said they should go through their own country of Judea. After that they should go to the country next to them. This was Samaria.

These words still speak to us today. We see many people in our own country who need evangelism. We see many people in countries around us

who need evangelism. There are needy people throughout the world. How are these people to hear about Christ? Someone will have to go to them.

5. Some of these people have never heard of Jesus. Do you think they will repent if someone visits them for only a few days? _____

A few of them may repent. But many of them need time. We must send someone to help these people. He must not just preach for a week. He must go and live near these people.

When someone is sent by the church and goes to live with people, we call him a missionary. We know some people like this. We see many European missionaries who have come to Africa.

6. Is it only a European who can be a missionary? _____

No! Any Christian who is called of God and sent by a church to do evangelism is a missionary. Acts 13:2 - 3:

While they were worshipping the Lord and fasting, the Holy Spirit said, "Set apart for me Barnabas and Saul for the work to which I have called them." Then after fasting and praying they laid their hands on them and sent them off.

7. Barnabas and Saul were called by God and sent by the church. We call them _____

So another way to do evangelism is through missionaries. How do missionaries do evangelism? They use all the ways of evangelism that we have learned. They preach and teach Sunday school. They have revival meetings. They have meetings for small groups. They visit. They do evangelism through work, through papers, through hospitals, prisons, schools and street meetings.

8. What are missionaries trying to get people to do? _____

Missionaries use all the ways to do evangelism. Some missionaries use one way more than others. That is because that way fits the people where they are. But all the ways of evangelism are used by missionaries at different places.

9. Think of the missionaries you know. What ways do they use to do evangelism?

Many missionaries we know have come far from their homes. Does this make them better missionaries? Must a person go very far from his home to be a missionary? No. You may see a group of people in your own country who need to hear the Good News. God may call you to go to them. Your church may agree to send you. If you go to live with those people and do evangelism, you are a missionary.

10. Another way to do evangelism is through _____

Sometimes a missionary in his own country is called a "home missionary". That is because he is still in the country of his home. But he is a missionary because he has been sent to live with other people and do evangelism. There are many "home missionaries" in Europe and America.

We have many African pastors and preachers. Are there any African missionaries? Yes, there are. One church in Nigeria has sent out 90 of its own members as missionaries. How is a missionary different from a pastor or a preacher? He is different because he is sent to live with other people.
