

**WEEK 3: JESUS SPOKE ABOUT HIMSELF**

**DAY 1: I AM THE MESSIAH**

**John 4:19-36. John 18:33-40.**

1. Last week we saw people meeting Jesus. This week we will learn things Jesus said about himself. In his gospel, John wrote more of what Jesus said than what He did.

What two things did Jesus tell the woman taken in adultery?

2. Jesus told her: I do not condemn you. Do not sin again. You remember that John wrote when he was an old man. The other writers had told many things Jesus did. But John also remembered many things which Jesus taught. He wanted everyone to know these things. So he wrote them. Today let us go back and learn what Jesus said about Himself.

- (1) When the woman of Samaria said she knew the Messiah was coming, Jesus said: I am He.
- (2) Messiah means "anointed."
- (3) When Pilate asked Jesus if He was a king, Jesus said: You say that I am a king.

In your Bible read John 4:19 to 26. Read verse 19 again. Who did the woman think Jesus was at first?

3. She thought He was a prophet. Jesus needed to tell her who He was. The woman knew that her people had different customs from the Jews. They did not agree on the proper place to worship God. But both groups agreed that the Messiah would come.

John 4:21:

Jesus said to her, "Believe me, woman, the time will come when people will not worship the Father either on this mountain or in Jerusalem.

Jesus was telling the woman that something better was coming. What do you think Jesus meant?

4. Be ready to talk about this in class. Jesus meant that there would be a better way to worship God. People would not have to go to a certain place. They would not have to worship Him in a certain way. Jesus said that some day people would give God the true worship that He wants.

John 4:25:

The woman said to him, "I know that the Messiah will come, and when he comes, he will tell us everything."

What woman was this who knew that the Messiah was coming? \_\_\_\_\_

5. It was the woman of Samaria. Her people were looking for the Messiah, as the Jews were. They did not fully understand what He would do. But they knew He would tell them everything. The word Messiah means "anointed." He was the one promised by God as the great Saviour.

John 4:26:

Jesus answered, I am he, I who am talking with you."

From this verse who was saying that He was the Messiah? \_\_\_\_\_

6. Jesus was saying this: God had promised that Messiah would come. "Messiah" is from the old Hebrew language used by the Jews. Long before Jesus came, God allowed kings to rule His people. When God chose a new king, he was set apart for his important work. A prophet poured oil on the head of the new king. This holy act was called the anointing of the new king.

What Hebrew word means "anointed"? \_\_\_\_\_

7. The word is: Messiah. God gave the people of Israel kings. But all through the Old Testament He promised to send a special one. He promised to send a King who would be over all kings. He promised to send the Messiah. He would be the anointed one, the great Saviour.

John 4:26:

Jesus answered, "I am he, I who am talking with you."

When the woman of Samaria said she knew the Messiah was coming, what did Jesus say? \_\_\_\_\_

8. Jesus said: I am he, who am talking with you. Let us remember just the first part of this answer: I am He. In the Greek language, "Christ" means the same as Messiah. Jesus was saying that He was God's anointed one. Luke tells us that Jesus once read these words about Himself from the Old Testament.

Luke 4:18:

The Spirit of the Lord is upon me, because he has chosen (or anointed) me to bring good news to the poor.

Messiah and Christ mean the same thing. What do they mean? \_\_\_\_\_

9. When you read your Bible look for the words "Messiah" and "Christ". They mean anointed."

John 4:10:

Jesus answered, "If you only knew what God gives and who it is that is asking you a drink, you would ask him, and he would give you life-giving water."

In today's lesson, who told the woman of Samaria that Jesus was the Messiah?

10. Jesus Himself said this. Some people say Jesus was a good man, but He was not the Messiah. He was not the Son of God. But they do not know what Jesus said about Himself. Jesus said that He was the Messiah. He was the King whom God promised to send. Near the end of the book of John Jesus talked about this again.

In your Bible read John 18:33-37. Read verse 33 again. What did Pilate ask Jesus?

11. Pilate asked Jesus if He was the King of the Jews. Remember that the King was the anointed one. He was the one whom God promised to send to save the people of Israel. In John 18 Jesus was being tried by Pilate. The Jews wanted Him killed.

What does Messiah mean? \_\_\_\_\_

12. Messiah means: anointed. Jesus asked Pilate whether he really wanted to know. Or whether the question came from other people. When we have honest questions, God will help us to understand. Jesus explained something about Himself to Pilate.

In your Bible read John 18:36 again. Who asked Jesus if He was a king? \_\_\_\_\_

=====

13. Pilate asked this. The Jews had brought Jesus to him. They must have told Pilate, "This man says He is the King." If Jesus was a king, then Pilate was in trouble. Pilate was the one ruling over Israel at that time. He needed to know what Jesus had said.

John 18:37:

So Pilate asked him, "Are you a king, then? Jesus answered, "You say that I am a king. I was born and came into the world for this one purpose, to speak about the truth. Whoever belongs to the truth listens to me."

When Pilate asked Jesus if He was a king, what is the first thing Jesus answered? \_\_\_\_\_

=====

14. Jesus answered: You say that I am a king. This meant: You say the truth. Again Jesus was agreeing that He was God's anointed one. He was the one whom God chose and promised to send. People who say that Jesus was only a good man make Him a liar. But if He is a liar, He is not a good man!

When the woman of Samaria said she knew the Messiah was coming, what did Jesus say? \_\_\_\_\_

15. Jesus said: I am He. Jesus was a man, but He was more than a man. He was the Son of God. He was also the eternal King whom God had promised to the people of Israel. He was the Messiah.

16. Messiah means: anointed. Jesus said to Pilate: You say that I am a King. Jesus explained that His kingdom was not like Pilate's. Jesus did not want to rule over earthly kingdoms at that time. But some day He will rule over everything and everyone.

Mr. Solomon is a Jewish man who lives in the big city of Johannesburg, South Africa. He lives there with many other Jewish people. They believe that the Messiah is still coming. They do not know that Jesus is the Messiah. They are still waiting for Him.

**WEEK 3: JESUS SPOKE ABOUT HIMSELF**

**DAY 2: THE FATHER AND I ARE ONE**

**John 5:17-29. John 10:29-38.**

1. For those who wanted to hear, Jesus said clearly who He was.

When the woman of Samaria said she knew the Messiah was coming, what did Jesus say? \_\_\_\_\_

2. Jesus told the woman of Samaria: I am He. Messiah means: Anointed. Jesus told Pilate: You say that I am a king. It is good to know what other people said about Jesus. But it is also good to know what He said about Himself. Today we will learn two more things Jesus said about Himself.

- (1) The Jews became angry when Jesus said that God was His own Father. This was because it made Him equal with God.
- (2) The work which the Father has given the Son to do in time to come is: to judge.

Take your Bible now and read John 5:17 to 21. Read verse 17 again. In these verse, what did Jesus call God? \_\_\_\_\_

3. He called God His Father. Jesus was never ashamed of who He was. Many times He spoke of His Father. You like to speak of your earthly father. Jesus liked to speak of His Father too. Whenever he spoke of his Father, He was always speaking of God. When He did this, He was saying something special.

John 5:18:

This saying made the Jewish authorities all the more determined to kill him; not only had he broken the Sabbath law, but he had said that God was his own Father and this way had made himself equal with God.

This tells us something about Jesus. With whom was he equal? \_\_\_\_\_

4. He was equal with God. We have already seen from John 1 that Jesus is God. Now Jesus Himself said things which showed that He is equal with God.

John 5:19:

So Jesus answered them, "I tell you the truth: the Son can do nothing on his own; he does only what he sees his Father doing. What the Father does, the Son also does.

When Jesus called God His own Father in this way, what did this say about Jesus?  
\_\_\_\_\_

5. It said that He was equal with God. Jesus did not work by Himself. He did what the Father was doing. Jesus had healed a man on the sabbath day. The Jews were angry about this. But What He did was wonderful. He had made someone well who had been sick for 38 years! This is how Jesus explained it.

John 5:20-21:

For the Father loves the Son and shows him all that he himself is doing. He will show him even greater things to do than this, and you will all be amazed. Just as the Father raises the dead and gives them life, in the same way the Son gives life to those he wants to.

How do the Father and Son measure up to each other? \_\_\_\_\_

6. They are equal. In John chapter 5, Jesus spoke about His Father many times. If you count, you will find the word Father 14 times in this chapter. Jesus wanted to show that His Father is God. He talked about this again at another time.

In your Bible read John 10:29 to 33. What people understood that Jesus was making Himself equal with God and wanted to kill him?

7. It was the Jews. They wanted to stone Jesus. Jesus asked which good deed they were stoning Him for.

John 10:33:

They answered, "We do not want to stone you because of any good deeds, but because of your blasphemy (or evil words)! You are only a man, but you are trying to make yourself God!"

Why did the Jews become angry when Jesus said that God was His own Father?

8. It was because this made Him equal with God. Jesus told them clearly that God was His Father. He also told them how He and His Father worked together.

John 10:30:

The Father and I are one.

But even though Jesus and the Father are equal, they have different work to do. The Father worked to send the Son. The Son came to the earth to die. The Son also has some special work to do in time to come.

In your Bible go back to John 5. Read verses 22 to 29. In verse 22, who does not judge?  
\_\_\_\_\_

9. The Father does not judge anyone. He has given this work to Jesus Christ, His Son. Jesus will judge those who have not believed. But there are some people who will not be judged for sin.

John 5:24:

I am telling you the truth: whoever hears my words and believes in him who sent me has eternal life. He will not be judged, but has already passed from death to life.

Who will not be judged for sin by Christ? \_\_\_\_\_

10. It is those who have believed. Believers will be judged for their works at another judgement. But those people will be judged for sin. The Father has given the Son the work of judging. Those who are not judged will rise to eternal life. Those who are judged will have eternal death. Othiambo is an old man. He knows he will not live much longer. He also knows he has not always been a good man. He is troubled about what will happen to him when he dies.

John 12:48:

Whoever rejects me and does not accept my message has one who will judge him. The words I have spoken will be his judge on the last day!

Those who believe will not be judged. But who will be judged by the Son and His words?

11. Those who do not believe will be judged. God gives us a way to be saved from sin and death. We can believe in Him. We can believe that God sent Jesus. We can believe that Jesus took the punishment for our sin.

John 5:27:

And he has given the Son the right to judge, because he is the Son of Man.

Who will have the special work of judging in the time to come? \_\_\_\_\_

12. Jesus will have this work. It has been given to Him by the Father. The Father gives the Son the right to judge and to give life.

John 5:26:

Just as the Father is himself the source of life, in the same way he has made his Son to be the source of life.

As we learned earlier, why did the Jews become angry when Jesus said that God was His own Father? \_\_\_\_\_

13. It is because this made Him equal with God. His powerful voice will raise the dead.

John 5:28-29:

Do not be surprised at this; the time is coming when all the dead will hear his voice and come out of their graves: those who have done good will rise and live, and those who have done evil will rise and be condemned.

What special work has the Father given the Son to do in the time to come? \_\_\_\_\_

14. The special work of Jesus will be: to judge. The book of John tells us many things which the other gospels do not. It tells many things which Jesus said. It tells us the thing He said about Himself. If we believe Jesus was a good man, we must believe these things.

Why does Jesus have the work of judging? It is because He took the punishment for our sins. Those who believe Him do not have to be judged.

It is wonderful to think about this! Take some time now to think and pray about it. Thank God for sending Jesus. Thank Him that you have believed and do not have to be judged for your sin.

**DAY 3: I AM THE BREAD OF LIFE**

**John 6:1-35.**

1. Why did the Jews become angry when Jesus said that God was His own Father?

2. The Jews became angry because this made Him equal with God. The special work of Jesus will be: to judge. It is very important that people believe in Jesus. That is why Jesus did miracles. That is also why He said so many things about Himself. Today we will see how Jesus fed 5000 people. But the people did not really understand. Let us learn two things about this.

- (1) The people did not understand the miracle of feeding 5000 because they were only looking for earthly things.
- (2) To show that we should receive Him and take life from Him every day, Jesus called Himself the Bread of Life.

In your Bible read John 6:26 to 35. Read verse 26 again. From this verse, did the people understand the miracle of bread rightly?

3. They did not understand. On this day Jesus had crossed over Lake Galilee. He sat down on a hill with His disciples.

John 6:2:

A large crowd followed Him because they had seen his miracles of healing the sick.

Were the people following Him because they wanted to worship God, or because they wanted earthly things?  
\_\_\_\_\_

4. They wanted earthly things. Jesus wanted to teach His disciples. But many people followed them. Jesus felt sorry for them because they had no food. Jesus also needed to show who He was by miracles. Jesus asked Philip where they could buy food for the people. He was testing Philip. Then Andrew found a boy with a bit of bread and fish.

Read John 6:11 in your Bible.

Who did not understand but looked only for earthly things? \_\_\_\_\_

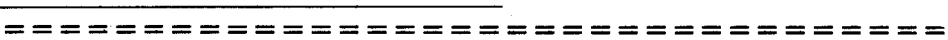

5. It was the people who did this. They wanted all the earthly things Jesus could give. But this was not the big thing Jesus wanted to do for them. Jesus is the Bread of Life. The food which He gave them was a sign. It showed that He would give Himself to people of all tribes and countries.

John 6:15:

Jesus knew that they were about to come and seize him in order to make him king by force; so he went off again to the hills by himself.

Why did the people want to make Jesus their earthly king? \_\_\_\_\_

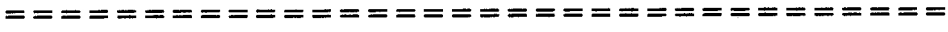


6. It was because of the miracles. They wanted all the earthly things. They were selfish. They did not really want to worship God through Christ. Let us see again what Jesus said to them.

John 6:26:

Jesus answered, "I am telling you the truth: you are looking for me because you ate the bread and had all you wanted, not because you understood my miracles.

From this verse, what did the people not understand? \_\_\_\_\_

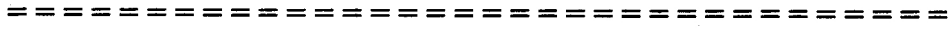


7. They did not understand the miracles. Jesus was doing the miracles to show that He was the Son of God. They liked the miracles because they wanted only earthly things. This is what Jesus told them.

John 6:27:

Do not work for food that spoils; instead, work for the food that lasts for eternal life. This is the food which the Son of Man will give you, because God, the Father, has put his mark of approval on him."

What was wrong with the way the people understood the miracle of feeding 5000? \_\_\_\_\_

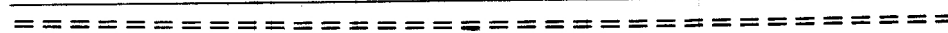


8. They wanted only earthly things. After Jesus talked to them, they tried to understand in a better way.

John 6:28-29:

So they asked him, "what can we do in order to do what God wants us to do?" Jesus answered, "What God wants you to do is to believe in the one he sent."

If they understood the miracle of feeding 5000 rightly, what would they do? \_\_\_\_\_

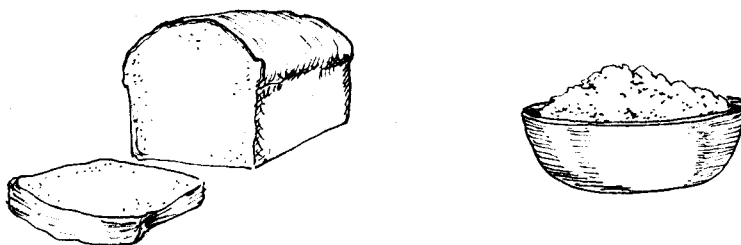


9. They would believe in the one God sent. That is Jesus. But instead, they were asking for food again. They reminded Jesus that in the time of Moses, the people received bread from heaven. It was called manna. But Jesus told them that that was not the true bread from heaven. The true bread from heaven is Jesus. He must be taken into people's lives.

In your Bible read John 6:32. We take food into our bodies. Who must we take into our lives in order to have spiritual food?

10. We must take Jesus into our lives. We must believe in Him. We must know that he is the one who gives us life. We must receive Him as our food. We should think of Him as our bread and our porridge.



John 6:33:

For the bread that God gives is he who comes down from heaven and gives life to the world.

When you eat food for your physical body, how often do you eat it? \_\_\_\_\_

11. You eat food every day. In the morning you may eat soft porridge. Perhaps in the evening you eat hard porridge. In the same way you must take life from Jesus every day.

John 6:34-35:

"Sir," they asked him, "give us this bread always." "I am the bread of life," Jesus told them. "He who comes to me will never be hungry; he who believes in me will never be thirsty."

What did Jesus call Himself to show that we should receive Him and take life from Him every day?  
\_\_\_\_\_

12. Jesus called Himself the Bread of Life. This showed what he wanted the people to understand about Him.

Sometimes we make a mistake here. We tell people that if they receive Christ, everything will be easy. We make them want to receive Christ for earthly things. God does make our lives better when we receive Christ. But this is not the biggest reason for receiving Christ.

What was wrong with the way the people understood the miracle of feeding 5000?

13. They wanted only earthly things. They did not see that there is much more to life than this. The things of earth are only a small part of God's blessings. The time we live here is only a small part of life. We are preparing for another life.

What did Jesus call Himself to show that we should receive Him and take life from Him every day?

14. Jesus called Himself the Bread of Life. He taught the people many words about this. The whole of John chapter 6 talks about it. We will learn more of it tomorrow.

John 6:40:

For what my Father wants is that all who see the Son and believe in him should have eternal life. And I will raise them to life on the last day.

Mr. Mwangi is a young married man in Kenya. He has a good wife and two children. He has a good job, food to eat, and clothes to wear. But he is not satisfied with his life. He does not see what he is living for. He does not know what will happen when he dies. What does Mr.Mwangi need?

**DAY 4: THE FATHER DRAWS PEOPLE TO ME**  
**John 6:36-70.**

1. Jesus had many ways to help people understand Him.

What is wrong with the way the people understood the miracle of feeding 5000?

What did Jesus call Himself to show that we should receive Him and take life from Him every day?

2. The people wanted only earthly things. Jesus called Himself the Bread of Life. If we want to live, we must receive Him. But how can we know Him? People say, "How can we know the right way? There are so many different teachings." Jesus said that the Father would help people come to Him. This is what we will learn today:

- (1) In John 6, Jesus said that to help people come to Jesus, the Father draws them.
- (2) Many people turned away from Jesus after He said they must eat His flesh and drink His blood.

Take your Bible now and read John 6:37 to 45. Read verse 37 again, From this verse who will come to Jesus?

3. Everyone whom the Father gives Him will come. The Father works in people's hearts. It is the Father who sent Jesus to earth. He also helps people to receive Jesus. Those who really want to obey God will be pulled to Jesus. Jesus explained why this is so.

John 6:38:

because I have come down from heaven to do not my own will but the will of him who sent me. And it is the will of who sent me that I should not lose any of all those he has given me, but that I should raise them all to life on the last day.

Who draws people's hearts to Jesus? \_\_\_\_\_

4. The Father does this. People say, "I do not understand. How can I know the way?" Jesus promised that if we want to know the way, God will show us. We will begin to know in our hearts what is the truth about Jesus. Next week we will see what Jesus said to people in the temple who were asking Him questions.

John 7:17:

Whoever is willing to do what God wants will know whether what I teach comes from God or whether I speak on my own authority.

To whom does the Father draw people? \_\_\_\_\_

5. He draws them to Jesus. He is the one who shows us what the Father is like. He is the one who died so that we could have fellowship with God again. Satan wants us to turn away from Christ. We should not listen to Satan.

John 6:39:

And it is the will of him who sent me that I should not lose any of all those he has given me, but that I should raise them all to life on the last day.

When the Father draws us, what does He help us do to Jesus? \_\_\_\_\_

6. He helps us to believe in Jesus. He helps us to understand that Jesus speaks the truth. He helps us come to Jesus with our sins. And then we pass from death to life.

John 6:40:

For what my Father wants is that all who see the Son and believe in him should have eternal life. And I will raise them to life on the last day.

In John 6, what does Jesus say helps people to come to Him? \_\_\_\_\_

7. The Father draws them. Jesus receives them all. He never turns anyone away. But the people must receive Jesus too. Remember that Jesus called Himself the Bread of life. This was to show the people that they must receive Him and take life from him every day. Soon the people began to grumble about this.

In your Bible read John 6:41 and 42. From what the people said, was it easy, or hard, to receive Jesus as their bread from heaven? \_\_\_\_\_

8. It was hard. It is hard for us to understand how another man could give us eternal life. But Jesus was more than a man. We have learned that He was also God. He was sent to earth for a special purpose.

John 6:51:

I am the living bread that came down from heaven. If anyone eats this bread, he will live forever. The bread that I will give him is my flesh, which I give so that the world may live.

Who is the bread that can make people live forever?

9. Jesus is the bread. We must take Him inside ourselves. We must let Him live in our hearts and minds. We must let Him be Lord of our lives. When we have decisions to make, we must find out what He wants. He says that He will give us His life.

John 6:53:

Jesus said to them, "I am telling you the truth: if you do not eat the flesh of the Son of Man and drink his blood, you will not have life in yourselves.

Why must we eat the flesh and drink the blood of Jesus? \_\_\_\_\_

10. We must do this so we can have life. We can live good lives now and we can live after death. Jesus said this again and again.

John 6:54:

Whoever eats my flesh and drinks my blood has eternal life, and I will raise him to life on the last day.

This is the fourth time Jesus said he would raise people up. He said it in verses 39, 40, 44, and 54!

In this lesson what must people do in order to have eternal life? \_\_\_\_\_

11. They must eat His flesh and drink His blood. We know what Jesus meant. He did not mean that people would do this with their mouths and their stomachs. He meant they would do it with their minds and their hearts.

John 6:60:

Many of his followers heard this and said, "this teaching is too hard. Who can listen to it?"

Did they understand what Jesus meant when He said they must eat His flesh and drink His blood?

12. They did not understand. They did not want to understand. They did not want to obey God. Remember that Jesus said, "If you want to do God's will, you will understand." Jesus had explained it very well.

John 6:56:

Whoever eats my flesh and drinks my blood lives in me, and I live in him.

What did Jesus say they must do to have eternal life? \_\_\_\_\_

13. They must eat His flesh and drink His blood. This meant that they must receive His sacrifice for their sins. He was giving His body in death. He was giving His blood in suffering. If they would believe this, they could live. But many did not believe.

John 6:66

Because of this, many of Jesus' followers turned back and would not go with him any more.

Why did the followers of Jesus turn back from Him at this time? \_\_\_\_\_

14. It was because Jesus said they must eat His flesh and drink His blood. Let us not make the same mistake they did. Let us pray to understand. Let us be willing to obey. Let us open our minds so the Father can draw us to Jesus.

What did many people do after Jesus said they must eat His flesh and drink His blood?  
\_\_\_\_\_

15. They turned back from Him. If we do not listen to the Father, we cannot receive the Son. Remember what Jesus said.

John 6:44:

No one can come to me unless the Father who sent me draws him to me; and I will raise him to life on the last day.

In John 6, what did Jesus say helps people come to Him? \_\_\_\_\_

16. The Father draws them. So you see that many people began to follow Jesus. They liked the miracles. They wanted the food which He gave to 5000 people. But they did not stay to understand what Jesus really wanted to give.

Some people are like that today. Mr. Ndiritu met a Christian man at his work. He saw that the Christian was different. He liked the way the Christian worked. He liked the peace which he saw in his life. One day Mr. Ndiritu went to church with his Christian friend. He went back again the next Sunday. But on the third Sunday he refused to go. He said he could not understand what the preacher was saying.

If you could talk to Mr. Ndiritu, what would you tell him from today's lesson?

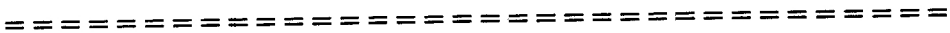
