

WEEK 4: JESUS GIVES LIVING WATER

DAY 1: HE WHO WANTS TO OBEY WILL KNOW THE TRUTH

John 7:1-24. John 4:7-14.

1. Last week we saw many different things Jesus said about Himself. This week we will learn one big one. First let us remember the last lesson.

In John 6 what did Jesus say helps people come to Him? _____

What did many people do after Jesus said they must eat His flesh and drink His blood?

=====

2. The thing which helps people come to Jesus is: The Father draws them. After Jesus talked about His flesh and blood, many people turned back from Him. But Jesus wants to give us eternal life. He wants to satisfy every need which we have. This is what He promised.

- (1) Jesus said He could give the Samaritan woman living water.
- (2) He said that those who are willing to do what God wants will know the truth about Jesus.

Take your Bible now and read John 7:10 to 18. Read verse 11 again. Were the leaders of the Jews thirsty for more of what Jesus taught?

=====

3. They were not thirsty for more. They were angry and wanted to kill Jesus. The brothers of Jesus were not believing either. They only saw Him as their earthly brother. The book of John tells us what they said to Him.

John 7:4-5:

No one hides what he is doing if he wants to be well known. Since you are doing these things, let the whole world know about you!" Not even his brothers believed in him.

Were the brothers of Jesus thirsty for more of what He taught? _____

=====

4. They were not thirsty either. But some people were thirsty for the things Jesus taught. Many people came to the temple to listen to what He said. In today's lesson you saw that Jesus went to the temple to teach. He talked about living water. But this is not the first time He talked about this. You remember that He and the Samaritan woman talked about water.

John 4:7:

A Samaritan woman came to draw water, and Jesus said to her, "give me a drink of water."

Where did the Samaritan woman meet Jesus? _____

5. She met him at the place to get water. It was at the well. Jesus asked her for a drink. You remember that she was surprised.

John 4:10:

Jesus answered, "If you only knew what God gives and who it is that is asking you for a drink, you would ask him, and he would give you life-giving (or living) water."

What did Jesus say He could give her? _____

6. He said He could give her living water. The woman was holding her water pot. She had come to the well because she needed water. Water is important to our lives. We need earthly water in order to live. But we also need spiritual water.

John 4:14

whoever drinks the water that I will give him will never thirsty again. The water that I will give him will become in him a spring which will provide him with life-giving water and give him eternal life.

Who could give the Samaritan woman living water? _____

7. Jesus could do this. Water has often been used as a picture of life. In the Old Testament the people of Israel once needed water.

Numbers 21:16-17:

... the Lord said to Moses, "Bring the people together, and I will give them water." At that time the people of Israel sang this song: "Wells, produce your water; and we will greet it with a song.

What did Jesus say He could give the Samaritan woman at the well? _____

8. He could give her living water. He could give her joy and peace which would not end. Later Jesus spoke of living water as He taught at the temple. Again he was speaking of Himself. He was helping the people know who He was. Those who were thirsty could drink. Those who wanted to do God's will could know the truth about Jesus.

John 7:16:

Jesus answered, "What I teach is not my own teaching, but it comes from God, who sent me.

In what book do we read more of what Jesus said than what He did? _____

=====

9. We read this in the book of John. John wanted people to know all the good things Jesus taught. Some people say it is hard to know the truth. Jesus told them how they could know the truth about Him.

John 7:17:

Whoever is willing to do what God wants will know whether what I teach comes from God or whether I speak on my own authority.

Who will know the truth about Jesus? _____

=====

10. It is those who want to do what God wants. This is the answer to the problem of knowing the truth.

Kamau is a young man in Kenya. He is clever and has gone to secondary school. He has heard about the Bible and about Jesus Christ. But there are many other things calling him. His father wants him to follow the teaching of the tribe about ancestral spirits. His older brother wants him to get a good job and give all his time to it. He says that Kamau can make lots of money and be happy. But Kamau has a friend who says that he has found joy and peace in Christ. He says that following Christ gives purpose to his life. Christ helps him live as he should.

If people want to do what God wants, about whom will they know the truth?__

=====

11. They will know the truth about Jesus, or Christ. Sometimes we are troubled. We do not know what is the truth. We think we will be happy if we get many things for ourselves. We think we will be happy if we give offerings to the ancestors. We do not know if Jesus can do all that He says.

If people really want to do what God wants, what will they know about Jesus?

=====
12. They will know the truth about Him. God will help them to understand. But if we do not want to obey God we will not understand. What we want in our hearts is what makes the difference.

From John 7:17, what will happen to those who are willing to do what God wants?

=====
13. They will know the truth about Jesus. When we know the truth we have deep joy. Our lives have purpose. We are living for God. He helps us. He gives us power. He gives us eternal life.

Washuka has trouble loving other people. She knows she should live well with all her family. But sometimes they do nothing which make her angry. She does not say anything, but she thinks bad thoughts about them. She is often sad. Sometimes she is afraid that she is a witch. But she has heard about Jesus. She wants to hear more about Him. She is hoping that He can help her think good about people instead of thinking evil.

What did Jesus say He could give the Samaritan woman at the well? _____

14. He could give her living water. He could give her good living here on earth. And He could give her eternal life in time to come. But she had to receive what he wanted to give.

Jesus can help Washuka. He can put living water inside her. She wants to know the truth about Jesus.

From John 7:17, what will happen to those who are willing to do what God wants?

15. They will know the truth about Jesus. Many people are thirsty today. They want more in their lives. They want more things, but these do not satisfy. They want more power. But they do not get the right kind of power.

Think of someone who seems to be thirsty in his life. Go to him and tell him what you learned in this lesson. What did he say?

DAY 2: COME TO ME AND DRINK

John 7:25-39

1. What did Jesus say He could give the Samaritan woman at the well? _____

From John 7:17, what will happen to those who are willing to do what God wants?

=====

2. Jesus said He could give the Samaritan woman living water. Those who are willing to do what God wants will know the truth about Jesus. Jesus was speaking about the deep needs of people. Today let us learn more that He said about the water of life.

- (1) Jesus said to those who are thirsty: Come to me and drink.
- (2) He said that streams of living water would come from the heart of one who believes.

In your Bible read what happened as Jesus taught in the temple. Read John 7:28 to 39. Did you read this?

=====

3. Jesus knew that some of the people in the temple were thirsty. They wanted more in life. They were not satisfied with things as they were. They were watching Jesus.

John 7:25-26:

Some of the people of Jerusalem said, "Isn't this the man the authorities are trying to kill? Look! He is talking in public, and they say nothing against him! Can it be that they really know that he is the Messiah?"

From this verse, who did the people look for who would help all their problems?

=====

4. They thought the Messiah would do this. But they were not sure about Jesus. Some were beginning to believe in Him. They did not fully understand.

John 7:31:

But many in the crowd believed in him and said, "When the Messiah comes will he perform more miracles than this man has?"

Who was doing miracles and saying, "Come to me and drink"? _____

=====

5 The one saying this was Jesus. He was the one who could satisfy their hearts. He could meet their needs. He would die for them and give them eternal life. They did not know that the Messiah would do this.

John 7:37:

On the last and most important day of the festival Jesus stood up and said in a loud voice, "Whoever is thirsty should come to me and drink.

What did Jesus say those who are thirsty should do? _____

=====

6. He said: Come to me and drink. Some of the people did not want to hear this. The leaders of the Jews were trying to kill Jesus. The Pharisees heard what the people were saying about Him. They sent guards to arrest Jesus.

John 7:33-34:

Jesus said, "I will be with you a little while longer, and then I shall go away to him who sent me. You will look for me, but you will not find me, because you cannot go where I will be."

Would the people always be able to listen to Jesus and come to Him and drink?

=====

7. They would not always be able to do this. Jesus would not always be with them. We can receive Him today. But we will not have this opportunity forever.

What did Jesus say to those who are thirsty? _____

=====

8. He said: Come to me and drink. You know how it feels to be thirsty. You know how it feels to have a good drink. We can be satisfied when we drink from Jesus. But Jesus said that more would also happen. Those who drank would also be able to help others. Jesus used words from the Old Testament to show this.

John 7:38:

As the scripture says, 'Whoever believes in me, streams of life-giving water will pour out from his heart.'

From whose heart did Jesus say that streams of living water will pour? _____

=====

9. They will pour from the heart of whoever believes in Jesus. This is exciting! If we truly believe in Jesus, we will have water to give to others. We will be able to help our families in the deepest way. We will be able to help our relatives, our neighbours, and our friends!

John 7:39:

Jesus said this about the Spirit, which those who believed in him were going to receive.

Who did Jesus say would cause the living water to pour from the hearts of those who believed?

=====

10. The Holy Spirit would do this. Remember that the Holy Spirit also is God. If we believe, God will be in us. We will receive His Holy Spirit. He will live in us. And He will pour out of us in ways that will help other people. Perhaps this is the most wonderful thing of all. When you help someone else you are truly happy.

What did Jesus say would pour from us as He talked about the Holy Spirit in us?

=====

11. He said that streams of living water would pour out. So then God helps others through us. Jesus promised to give us living water. Then we can give living water to others. By the power of the Holy Spirit we can tell them about sin and salvation. We can help them with their problems. We can show them the right way to live.

After we believe, where do streams of living water come from? _____

=====

12. They come from inside us. They come from our hearts. And they flow out to others.

One evening in 1960 Geoffrey Muchoki of Kenya went to Thika town for some cigarettes. Going home he heard a man preaching near the market. Geoffrey stopped to listen. As the man spoke, Geoffrey thought of his own life. "I have lived many years as a sinner, a drunkard and tobacco user. My life is empty. But this man says I can have real life through Jesus." When the preacher asked if anyone wanted God's forgiveness, Geoffrey went forward. That day Jesus forgave his sins and gave him new life. He also freed him from his old ways. Rev. Muchoki is now a church overseer for Nyeri District. He enjoys helping other people find the life that Christ gives.

What did Jesus say would come from the heart of one who believes? _____

=====

13. They will know the truth about Jesus. When we know the truth we have deep joy. Our lives have purpose. We are living for God. He helps us. He gives us power. He gives us eternal life.

Washuka has trouble loving other people. She knows she should live well with all her family. But sometimes they do things which make her angry. She does not say anything, but she thinks bad thoughts about them. She is often sad. Sometimes she is afraid that she is a witch. But she has heard about Jesus. She wants to hear more about Him. 14. He said: Come to me and drink. In Christ we can be truly satisfied. If only we could show our people this! They want clothes, money, positions, power, and learning. Some of these things are good. But they are not enough. We need Christ in our lives.

Your people should hear the truths of this lesson. Prepare a sermon or lesson to give them. On another paper write the big things you will say. Preach the sermon if you can. Bring your paper to class for the leader to see.

WEEK 4: JESUS GIVES LIVING WATER

DAY 3: SOME ARE NOT THIRSTY

John 7:40-52

1. Jesus tried in every way He could to show who He was. He tried in every way to show what He could give people. He knew that only He could satisfy their needs.

What did Jesus say to those who are thirsty? _____

What did Jesus say would come from the heart of one who believes? _____

=====

2. Jesus said to the thirsty: Come to me and drink. He said that streams of living water will come from the heart of the believer. But some of the people in Jesus' time were not thirsty. They did not see that they had needs. They set their wills against Jesus. Therefore they could not understand and believe.

Today we will learn:

The main reason why the leaders
of the Jews could not understand
and believe in Jesus was that
they did not want to.

In your Bible read John 7:40 to 52. Read verse 41 again. In this verse, who did some of the people believe Jesus was? _____

=====

3. Some believed He was the Messiah. They believed He was the anointed one, the one who was promised. But others did not want to believe this. So they did not see the truth.

John 7:41-42:

But others said, "The Messiah will not come from Galilee! The scripture says that the Messiah will be a descendant of King David and will be born in Bethlehem, the town where David lived."

Did these people ask Jesus where He was born? _____
=====

4. They did not ask him. We know that Jesus was born in Bethlehem. He was the very one who had been written about in the Old Testament. But if someone does not want to believe, he does not find out these things. He only looks for reasons not to believe.

John 7:43-44:

So there was a division in the crowd because of Jesus. Some wanted to seize (or arrest) him, but no one laid a hand on him.

What did some want to do with Jesus? _____

=====

5. They wanted to arrest Him. We know that some of the leaders wanted to kill Him. This is what we do sometimes when we do not want to believe. We try to get rid of the things that convict us. When we see our sin we try to stop the thing that shows it to us. Then we think we will be all right. The leaders of the Jews did not try to understand. This is what some of them said.

John 7:27:

But when the Messiah comes, no one will know where he is from. And we all know where this man comes from.

Who did not want to believe in Jesus? _____

=====

6. It was the leaders of the Jews. If they believed in Jesus, they would have to change their ways. They would not be able to have power over the people. They would not be able to teach the law in the way they wanted. They would not be able to cheat the people any longer. So they did not want to understand Jesus.

John 7:36:

He says that we will look for him but will not find him, and that we cannot go where he will be. What does he mean?

What is the main reason why the leaders of the Jews could not understand and did not believe in Jesus? _____

=====

7. They did not want to. Instead they wanted to get rid of Jesus. They sent guards to arrest Jesus. But the guards stayed and listened to the teaching.

John 7:45-46:

When the guards went back, the chief priests and pharisees asked them, "Why did you not bring him?" The guards answered, "Nobody has ever talked the way this man does!"

Remember what we learned day before yesterday. From John 7:17, what will happen to those who are willing to do what God wants?

=====

8. They will know the truth about Jesus. But the leaders of the Jews did not want to do what God wants. They said the guards had been fooled by Jesus. They also said this.

John 7:48:

Have you ever known one of the authorities or one Pharisee to believe in him? This crowd does not know the Law of Moses, so they are under God's curse!

Jesus said that the law of Moses spoke about Him. Why didn't the leaders of the Jews see this?

=====

9. They did not want to believe in Jesus. Therefore they did not see the truth about Him. But not all of the Jewish leaders were the same. We have learned about one who came to ask Jesus good questions. He listened to what Jesus said.

In your Bible read John 7:50 and 51 again. Who was trying to understand Jesus?

=====

10. This was Nicodemus. When he spoke this way the others laughed at him. They told him that he did not know the writings. But they were the ones who were wrong.

John 7:52:

“Well.” they answered, “are you also from Galilee? Study the Scriptures and you will learn that no prophet ever comes from Galilee.”

Jesus came from Galilee. He was not a prophet. He was the Son of God. He could have given the leaders of the Jews eternal life.

What is the main reason why the leaders of the Jews could not understand and did not believe in Jesus?

=====

11. They did not want to. Sometimes we talk with people who should believe. They ask us many questions. Sometimes we can answer these questions. Sometimes we cannot. They say they do not believe because the truth is not clear. But the truth is that they do not want to believe. Perhaps this seems like a small problem. But it is really very big. We can rule our own will. We can say Yes to God. Or we can say No. If we say No, then God stops showing things to us. Our minds become dark. We cannot believe.

Have you ever talked with someone who had trouble understanding about Jesus?

=====

12. We meet people like that sometimes. They may be very clever people. They may be leaders or teachers. But they have no time for God. This is what Jesus said later to the leaders of the Jews.

John 8:43:

Why do you not understand what I say? It is because you cannot bear to listen to my message.

Stop now and pray for someone you know who does not want to believe. Ask God to show him how good it is to be a Christian.

WEEK 4: JESUS GIVES LIVING WATER

DAY 4: I AM WHO I AM

John 8:21-30, 48-50 John 13:18-20.

1. Yesterday we learned something important about believing.

What is the main reason why the leaders of the Jews could not understand and did not believe in Jesus?

=====

2. They did not believe because they did not want to. When our will is against God He does not break it down. He lets us choose our way. But Jesus did all He could to help us see that He is God. He did all He could to help us see what He did for us. Jesus told the leaders of the Jews that He had a special name.

The name of God in Exodus
which Jesus used for
Himself is: I AM

You will see this in your Bible. Read John 8:21 to 30. Read verse 21 again. What did Jesus say would happen to the Jewish leaders because they did not believe in Him?

=====

3. They would die in their sins. But Jesus went on and tried to teach them more. This is what He said.

John 8:23:

You belong to this world here below, but I come from above. You are from this world, but I am not from this world.

What do you think Jesus was trying to show them about Himself? _____

=====

4. Perhaps you wrote that He was trying to show them where He came from. Perhaps you wrote He was trying to show them that He was God.

John 8:24:

That is why I told you that you will die in your sins. And you will die in your sins if you do not believe that 'I Am Who I AM'.

What would they have to believe if they did not want to die in their sins? _____

=====

5. They would have to believe that Jesus was who He was. They would have to accept His name, "I AM." This was a very strange name for Jesus. But it was not the first time it was used. It was from the Old Testament. God had asked Moses to lead the people of Israel. Moses asked who he should tell the people had sent him.

Exodus 3:14:

God said, "I am who I am. You must tell them: The one who is called I AM has sent me to you."

What did God call Himself when speaking to Moses? _____

=====

6. He called himself: I AM. Now see again what Jesus said.

John 8:24:

... you will die in your sins if you do not believe that 'I AM Who I AM.'

When Jesus used this name, what was He saying about Himself? _____

=====

7. He was saying that He is God. He was saying that He is the same person who talked with Moses back in the book of Exodus. But again the people asked who He was.

John 8:25-27:

"Who are you?" they asked him. Jesus answered, "What I have told you from the very beginning. I have much to say about you, much to condemn you for. The one who sent me, however, is truthful, and I tell the world only what I have from him." They did not understand that Jesus was talking to them about the Father.

Who said that His name was I AM, like God who spoke in the book of Exodus?

=====

8. Jesus said this. The people did not understand that He was talking about God His Father.

John 8:28:

So he said to them, "When you lift up the Son of Man, you will know that 'I AM Who I AM'; then you will know that I do nothing on my own authority, but I say only what the Father has instructed me to say.

In the book of John, Jesus called Himself I am. But who called Himself I AM in the book of Exodus?

=====

9. God did this. God the Father sent the Son into the world for a special purpose. He would die for the sins of the world.

John 8:29:

And he who sent me is with me; he has not left me alone, because I always do what pleases him."

What name did Jesus call Himself which is the name of God in the book of Exodus?

=====

10. That name was: I AM. Later Jesus talked with the Jewish leaders about this again. He said that whoever obeyed his teaching would never die.

In your Bible read John 8:52 and 53. Did Jesus mean to say that He was greater than Abraham?

=====

11. Yes, Jesus was saying that He is God. Of course God is greater than Abraham. Jesus told the people that Abraham looked forward to the time of Jesus.

John 8:57:58:

"I am telling you the truth," Jesus replied. "Before Abraham was born, 'I AM'."

What name did Jesus call Himself, which is the name of God in the book of Exodus?

=====

12. Jesus said His name was: I AM. This made the leaders very angry. They picked up stones to kill Jesus. But he hid Himself from them. Later Jesus talked about this again to His disciples. He was telling them that he would be betrayed by Judas.

John 13:19:

I tell you this now before it happens, so that when it does happen, you will believe that 'I AM Who I AM,'

It is hard to change our thoughts about certain things. The disciple and the Jewish leaders believed that the Messiah was coming. This was good. But they thought He would be an earthly king. Now Jesus was saying that He was the Messiah and He was God. He was showing that God Himself came down to earth. The Messiah would die for each man's sin.

Perhaps your people had certain beliefs too. What are some early beliefs of your people which were good? _____

What are some early beliefs of your people which need to be changed? _____

=====

13. Be ready to talk about these answers in class. There is so much here to teach us. Many African people believe that God made the earth. But then He moved away from it. They believe He does not care about it any longer. Jesus showed that God loves the world. He still cares about people and how they feel. He cares about how they live. He sent Jesus to die for us. And Jesus Himself is God. It is hard to understand all this. But if we want to believe, we can know.

If you were one of the people who heard Jesus speak, what would you have liked to ask Him? _____

14. Perhaps there will be time to talk about these questions in class.

WEEK 4: JESUS GIVES LIVING WATER
DAY 5: THE TRUTH WILL SET YOU FREE

John 8:31-47. John 14:6.

1. We see that the trouble between the Jews and Jesus was getting worse. First the Jews were angry because Jesus healed on the sabbath day. Then they were angry because Jesus made Himself equal with God. Then Jesus called Himself a name which said He was God.

What name did Jesus call Himself, which is the name of God in the book of Exodus?

=====

2. The name is: I AM. Jesus was trying to help people believe in Him. Some of the people did believe. Jesus wanted to help them keep on following Him. So He taught them about obeying His teachings. We will learn two things which He said about this.

- (1) In John 8:31-32 Jesus said: If you obey my teaching, you are really my disciples; you will know the truth, and the truth will set you free.
- (2) Because they did not believe the truth, the leaders of the Jews were the children of the devil.

Take your Bible now and read John 8:31 to 38. Read verses 31 and 32 again. If the people obeyed His teachings and were really His disciples, what would they know?

=====

3. This is something like what we learned at the beginning of the week. We learned what happens if people want to do what God wants. They will know the truth about Jesus. Now Jesus was telling them more about truth. We will see that He talked about it again on the night before He was crucified.

John 14:6:

I am the way, the truth, and the life.

In your Bible read John 8:32 again. If the people knew the truth, what would it do for them?

4. It would set them free. The people were surprised when Jesus said this. They did not know that they were slaves. They told Jesus that they were children of Abraham. They had never been slaves to anyone. But Jesus was talking about a different kind of slave.

John 8:34:

Jesus said to them, "I am telling you the truth: everyone who sins is a slave of sin.

Without Christ, how many people in the world are slaves to sin and need to be set free?

=====
5. This is true of all people. The old people of Africa knew more about slaves than we do today. Sometimes one tribe fought another tribe. They took some of the people as slaves. It was terrible to be a slave. A slave was not free to live his own life. He had to serve someone he did not want to serve. But Jesus was saying that everyone is a slave to sin. People serve sin when they do not want to. They cannot free themselves.

John 8:36:

If the Son sets you free, then you will be really free.

Jesus, the Son, shows us the truth, and what will the truth do for us? _____

=====
6. The truth will set us free. Oh, it is wonderful to be freed from sin! You know how it feels to do things you do not want to do. You know they are wrong, but you cannot stop. You are a slave to sin. But then you hear about Jesus. You hear the truth that He is the Son of God. You hear that the He took the punishment for your sin. You receive the truth. You are freed from your sin. That is what Jesus wanted the people to understand.

John 8:31-32:

If you obey my teaching, you are really my disciples; you will know the truth, and the truth will set you free.

These are important verses. Take time to memorise them now. When you know them well, hide the words. Write the verses here.

John 8:31-32: _____

7. Jesus said the leaders of the Jews were slaves to sin. He also said they were children of the devil. This was because they did not believe the truth. Jesus said many things to the Jews about this.

In your Bible read John 8:39 to 45. Read verse 40 again. In this verse, what did Jesus say He had told them?

=====

8. He had told them the truth. But they wanted to kill Him. This is what happens when we turn from the truth. If we do not want to believe the truth, then we believe lies. We are confused. We are deceived. We think we are right when we are wrong.

The leaders of the Jews wanted to kill Jesus. They thought He was a bad man. The things He said touched their lives too much.

John 8:43:

Why do you not understand what I say? It is because you cannot bear to listen to my message.

Who were children of the devil because they did not believe the truth? _____

=====

9. They were the leaders of the Jews. This was very hard for them to hear. It is hard for us to hear today. But if we refuse to believe in Christ, it is true for us too.

John 8:44:

You are the children of your father, the devil, and you want to follow your own desires. From the very beginning he was a murderer and has never been on the side of truth, because there is no truth in him.

The leaders of the Jews were the children of whom? _____

=====

10. They were the children of the devil. They were believing lies. They were deceived, but they had chosen to go that way.

John 8:44-45:

... When he (the devil) tells a lie, he is only doing what is natural to him, because he is a liar and the father of all lies. But I tell the truth, and that is why you do not believe me.

Jesus said He was the truth. What did He say the truth would do for those who know it? Answer by saying John 8:31-32.

=====

11. Look in your Bible to see if you said it right. Some people are free. They believe the truth. They believe in Jesus. But some people are slaves. They believe lies. They are slaves to sin. Jesus said one more thing to the leaders of the Jews.

John 8:47:
