

WEEK 8: JESUS IS THE TRUE VINE
DAY 1: WE CAN DO NOTHING WITHOUT HIM
John 15:1-10.

1. Last week we learned much about love. In love Jesus sent us the Holy Spirit from the Father.

2. The Holy Spirit is our Counselor and our Teacher. This week we will learn what Jesus said about staying united with him. Jesus said that He is like the stem of a plant. And we must be joined with Him. We will memorise this verse.

John 15:5: I am the vine, and you
are the branches. Whoever remains in
me and I in him, will bear much fruit;
for you can do thing without me.

Take your Bible now and read John 15:1 to 10. Read verse 1 again. Who is the one who takes care of the vine and the branches?

3. This is the Father. He is like a farmer who takes good care of his trees. He takes away the branches that do not bear fruit. He cuts back some branches so they will bear more fruit. Perhaps you have a guava tree or some grape vines. These plants need to be cut back sometimes. I am sure you have seen a pumpkin or squash growing. Pumpkins grow on vines.



Who did Jesus say is the vine? _____

4. Jesus said that He is the vine. The vine carries food and water from the roots to the branches. The branches receive life from the vine. The believers receive life from Jesus.

In John 15:5, who are the branches? _____

5. The believers are the branches. In order to have life, the branches must stay united with the vine. A branch cannot bear fruit by itself.

John 15:2:

He (the Father) breaks off every branch in me that does not bear fruit, and he prunes (or cuts back) every branch that does bear fruit, so that it will be clean and bear more fruit.

Many believers do not seem to bear any fruit. In this verse, what happens to the branch that does not bear fruit?

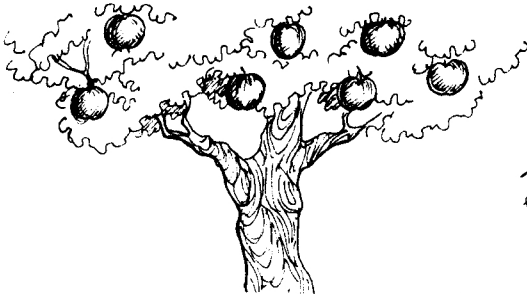
6. The Father breaks it off. Jesus did not want this to happen to the believers.

John 15:4:

Remain united to me, and I will remain united to you. A branch cannot bear by itself; it can do so only if it remains in the vine. In the same way you cannot bear fruit unless you remain in me.

What happens if a branch is separated from the vine? _____

7. We know that it dies. Jesus wants us to bear much fruit. But there are two things which happen to branches. Some branches bear fruits. Other branches are gathered for the fire and burned. In the first picture, the branches are joined to the tree. They are bearing nice fruit. In the second picture, the woman has gathered the dead branches to be burned in the fire.



The believers are the branches. Which branches bear fruit? _____

8. It is the ones which stay joined to the tree. The believers who bear fruits are the ones who stay united with Jesus. We cannot expect to choose our own selfish way and then live useful lives. We must choose the way to Christ. We must obey His commands. We must stay united with Him.

If a branch stays joined to the vine, what is it expected to do? _____

9. It is expected to bear fruit. And Christ expects us to bear fruit.

John 15:5:

I am the vine, and you are branches. Whoever remains in me and I in him, will bear much fruit; for you can do nothing without me.

How much fruit can we bear without Christ? _____

10. We can bear no fruit unless we are joined to Christ. There was another time when Jesus spoke to the people about fruit.

Matthew 7:15:17:

Be on your guard against false prophets ... You will know them by what they do. Thorn bushes do not bear grapes, and briars do not bear figs. A healthy tree bears good fruit, but a poor tree bears bad fruit.

How can we see whether people are joined to Christ or not? _____

11. We can see by their fruit. People can also see the fruit we bear. People should see that we have the Holy Spirit. They should see that we do the things Christ tells us. When a branch is taken from a tree it dies. This is why we must stay united with Christ. We can stay united by reading the Bible, meeting with other Christians, and praying. Sometimes people have trouble with this when they move to the city. They leave their church and their people. They do not find another church where they have help to stay close to Jesus.

What can we do without Christ? _____

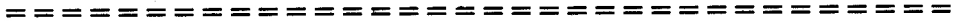
12. We can do nothing. A dead branch can only be carried away and burned. We can do nothing on our own. We must stay strong in Jesus.

13. We have been talking about bearing fruit. One good way to bear fruit is to bring someone back to Jesus. Perhaps you know someone who was once a strong Christian. But now he does not care about spiritual things.

14. It is important for you to speak to people often about Jesus. As you take strength from him, you will bear fruit. Some Christians try to make people become Christians by their own power. We cannot do this by ourselves. Jesus told us how it is to be done.

John 15:5:

I am the vine, and you are the branches. Whoever remains in me and I in him, will bear much fruit; for you can do nothing without me.

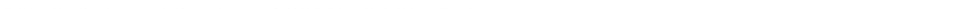


15. We can do nothing unless we have help from Jesus. We must stay united with him. How do we do that? We read the Bible, and pray, and go to church. We obey what God shows us. We let Christ control every thought and action.

Mr. Singh was troubled about his life. He did not have peace and joy. He always seemed to be thinking evil thoughts about other people. He was afraid that he was bringing trouble into their lives by his thoughts. Then he heard that Jesus could give him victory. From the time he heard this, he began to dream about Jesus. In his dreams Jesus helped him turn away from his evil thoughts. He was happy and was helping other people. Finally Mr. Singh received Christ. He allowed Christ to control every part of his life. The evil thoughts were gone. Instead there was peace.

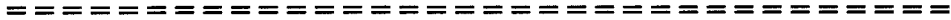

WEEK 8: JESUS IS THE TRUE VINE
DAY 2: ABIDING IN JESUS BRINGS FRUIT
John 15:11-21. John 16:23-24.

1. Yesterday we learned about staying united with Christ. Today we will learn about the fruit which we can bear.

But first, say John 15:5 to yourself.



2. Look in your Bible to see if you said the verse right. When we stay united with Christ we have many good things in our lives. Jesus taught the disciples about this on the night before He was crucified. Let us learn two of these good things today.

- (1) Because Jesus' disciples were obeying His commands, staying in His love, and bearing fruit, Jesus called them His friends.
- (2) If we stay united with Jesus and His word stays in us, we can ask God for something and we will have it.

In your Bible read John 15:11 to 16. In verse 11, what did Jesus want the disciples to have?

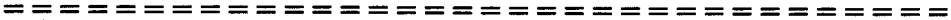


3. He wanted them to have joy. Joy is one of the fruits which we should bear. It is part of the fruit of the Spirit which Paul wrote about.

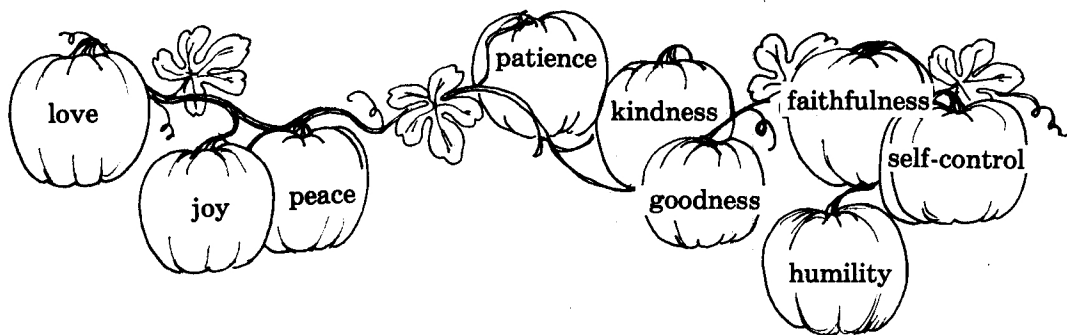
Galatians 5:22:

But the Spirit produces love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, humility, and self-control.

4. We must stay united with Him. We can have all these good things as fruit in our lives.



John 15:12:

My commandment is this: love one another, just as I love you.

In this verse, which fruit did Jesus say we should have? _____

5. This fruit is love. We have seen that there is love between the Father and Son. There is love between the Son and us. There is love between us and other people.

John 15:13-14:

The greatest love a person can have for his friends is to give his life for them. And you are my friends if you do what I command you.

Jesus said we are his friends if we do what? _____

=====

6. We are His friends if we do what He commands. Obeying His commands is one way of bearing fruit. One of His commands is that we love one another. Love is a good fruit to have in our lives.

John 15:15:

I do not call you servants any longer, because a servant does not know what his master is doing. Instead, I call you friends, because I have told you everything I heard from my Father.

From this verse, because Jesus loves us and we stay in His love, what does He call us?

7. He calls us friends. He calls us this if we do what He commands. One thing which He commands is that we tell people about Him. This is another kind of fruit besides love, joy, and peace.

People around us are not worshipping Christ. They are living for ancestral spirits, or money, or for the things money can buy. These things cannot save them. But God does not want these people to be lost. God wants them to know Jesus as Lord and Saviour. Bringing people to Jesus is a good way to bear fruit.

John 15:16:

You did not choose me; I chose you and appointed you to go and bear much fruit, the kind of fruit that endures.

Think of someone near you who needs to be brought to Jesus. Stop now and pray for that person. Pray that you will bear fruit by helping him receive Jesus. Remember that as you do this Jesus calls you His friend.

=====

8. Mr. Zondi raises pumpkins in his garden. He likes them very much when they are cooked just right. One day he planted some new ones. First the flower bloomed on the branch. Then the pumpkins started to grow. Mr. Zondi was happy.

But Mr. Zondi's son had a little dog. One day the dog chewed the pumpkin vine into pieces. The pumpkin stopped growing. It withered and died. Mr. Zondi was disappointed. The vine would not have any fruit. We too can be separated from our vine.

Because His disciples were keeping His commands, staying united to Him, and bearing fruit, what did Jesus call them?

9. He called them friends. But we can have more than this. Remember this promise from yesterday's lesson.

John 15:7:

If you remain in me and my words remain in you, then you will ask for anything you wish, and you shall have it.

That makes me happy. God says we can have answers to all our prayers.

What must we let Jesus' words do, so that whatever we ask we will have?_____

10. We must let His words remain in us. Then we can ask. We must also be bearing fruit. There is more to the verse about bearing fruit.

John 15:16:

You did not choose me, I chose you and appointed you to go and bear much fruit, the kind of fruit that endures. And so the Father will give you whatever you ask of him in my name.

In whom must we stay, so that we ask God for something and we will have it?

=====

11. We must stay in Jesus. We must ask for things in His name. This means we ask for the things which He wants. We ask for fruit in our lives. We ask for love, joy, peace, and patience. We ask that we may bring other people to Jesus. God promises that when we ask for something we will have it. But there are certain things we must do too.

Let us say that you have a field of sugar cane. You promise a man a certain amount of money if he hoes the field and takes out the weeds.

What happens if he does not hoe the field?_____

12. The man does not get the money. Some people say that God does not answer prayer. They say that He makes promises which He does not keep. But the problem is that they are not doing what God asks. God asks that we stay united with Jesus and let His words stay in us.

What happens if we stay in Jesus and His words stay in us, and we ask God for something?

=====

13. We will have it. Let us see the verses again.

John 15:7:

If you remain in me and my words in you, then you will ask for anything you wish, and you shall have it.

John 15:16:

... I chose you and appointed you to go and bear much fruit, the kind of fruit that endures. And so the Father will give you whatever you ask of him in my name.

Because the disciples were keeping His commands, staying in His love, and bearing fruit, what did Jesus call them in John 15?

14. Jesus called them friends. He also gave them a great promise. Jesus still does this for us today. He calls us His friends and shows us everything the Father is saying. He tells us to stay in Him. He tells us to keep His words in us. He tells us to bear fruit.

We can bear fruit when we work for the Lord. We can bring people to Jesus. We can pray for the sick. We can preach God's word. God will help us to do all these things. He hears our prayers.

If we remain in Jesus and His word remains in us, what happens when we ask God for something?

15. We will have it. We need to preach about this to our people. But we must be sure that we are giving God's full message. One day I was visiting in Chiduba Village. The chief sent me a message. The message said that I was invited for tea at ten o'clock that morning. The messenger could not change the message. He could not invite me for dinner. I received and obeyed the message and had a good time with the chief.

We must preach God's message that He answers prayer. But we must be sure we say what God is saying. We must preach the right thing about how to receive answers.

Why do we sometimes not receive answers to our prayers? _____

WEEK 8: JESUS IS THE TRUE VINE

DAY 3: I HAVE OVERCOME THE WORLD

John 15:18-25. John 16:1-4. John 16:16-33.

1. When Jesus is the vine and we are the branches important things happen.

Because His disciples were keeping His commands, remaining in His love, and bearing fruit, what did Jesus call them? _____

If we remain in Jesus and His words remain in us, what happens when we ask God for something? _____

2. Jesus called His disciples friends. He calls us that too. If we remain in Jesus, we can ask God for something and we will have it. This sounds easy. But it is not easy. Remaining in Christ is sometimes difficult. Following His words which are in us may bring us trouble. Jesus taught the disciples about this.

- (1) Jesus said the disciples would have troubles because they were united with Him,
- (2) At the end of John 16 He said these words to encourage them: I have overcome the world.

Jesus often spoke about trouble in the world. First read John 15:18 to 21. Read verse 19 again. From these, who hates the believers? _____

=====

3. The world hates the believers. Sometimes we are surprised at this. We think that everything should go well for us. Because we are obeying God, we think people should respect us. But Jesus said that something else would happen.

Who was Jesus speaking to when He said they would have troubles in the world? _____

=====

4. He was speaking to His disciples. He was wanting to help them. What He said is also for us. God knows that it is sometimes hard for us to follow Him. People fight against us or laugh at us. We may be tempted to forget about being Christians. Jesus knew the disciples would be tempted in this way.

John 16:1-2:

I have told you this, so that you will not give up your faith. You will be expelled (or driven out) from the synagogues, and the time will come when anyone who kills you will think that by doing this he is serving God.

From this verse, why did Jesus tell the disciples that they would have troubles in the world?

=====

5. He said this so they would not give up their faith. It would be very hard for the disciples. And it will sometimes be very hard for us.

John 16:3:

People will do these things to you because they have not known either the Father or me.

Although they would have His peace, what did Jesus say the disciples would have in the world because they were united with Him?

=====

6. He said they would have troubles. Because they knew these troubles were coming, they would not be surprised. They would not be discouraged. They would know that God was allowing this to happen. And God was still ruling.

John 16:4:

But I have told you this, so that when the time comes for them to do these things, you will remember what I told you.

What did Jesus do to help the disciples and us be prepared for troubles in the world?

=====

7. Jesus told us that they would come. He told the disciples that they would be very bad. Remember that Jesus was sitting with them on the last night before he died. He told them that He was leaving them. He told them how the world would treat them.

Although they would have His peace what did Jesus say the disciples would have in the world because they were united with Him?

=====

8. He said that they would have troubles. But then He encouraged them. He told them that their sorrow would turn to joy. He said that He would leave them for a little while. Then He would return to them. They would be happy even though the world gave them trouble.

John 16:20:

I am telling you the truth: you will cry and weep, but the world will be glad; you will be sad, but your sadness will turn into gladness.

Jesus told them why they could be happy. In your Bible read John 16:25 to 33 Read verse 33 again. What has Jesus done to the world? _____

=====

9. He has overcome it or defeated it. Even though there is trouble in the world, there are many reasons to be happy. We can be encouraged.

John 16:27:

for the Father himself loves you. He loves you because you love me and have believed that I came from God.

Who came from the Father and overcome the world? _____

=====

10. Jesus is the one who overcame the world. He overcame it in a strange way. He overcame it by dying. He came into the world. He lived here as a man. As He was speaking to the disciples, He would die the next day to break the power of sin. Soon His work would be finished.

John 16:28:

I did come from the Father, and I came into the world; and now I am leaving the world and going to the Father.

Why do you think Jesus was leaving the world now? _____

=====

11. Perhaps you wrote: Because His work was finished. Or perhaps you wrote: It was better for the disciples. Or perhaps you had another good answer. Be ready to share it in class.

When Jesus died He said, "It is finished." He had paid the price for sin. He was ready to give all His followers eternal life. Their lives would not end with this world.

Besides overcoming sin, what did Jesus overcome? _____

=====

12. He overcame the world. This is good news. We do not have to be sad. We do not have to be overcome by those around us. This is what Jesus said.

John 16:33:

I have told you this so that you will have peace by being united to me. The world will make you suffer. But be brave! I have defeated (or overcome) the world.

What did Jesus say about the world to encourage the disciples? _____

13. He said: I have overcome the world. He wanted the disciples to know what would happen. He wanted them to be prepared.

John 16:32:

The time is coming and is already here, when all of you will be scattered, each one to his own home, and I will be left alone. But I am not really alone, because the Father is with me.

Although they would have His peace, what did Jesus say the disciples would have in the world because they were united with Him? _____

=====

14. He said they would have troubles. They told Jesus that they believed in Him. Then Jesus told them how hard it would be for them. They would be afraid and would go to their homes. But God would be with Jesus. And He will be with each of us when we have hard times.

At the end of John 16, what did Jesus say about the world to encourage the disciples? _____

15. He said: I have overcome the world.

Sipho was not a Christian. But one day she heard that Jesus could forgive her sins. She went to church to hear about Him. She believed and received Him into her life. But she still had many troubles. Her husband laughed at her new faith. Her parents were angry because she was going to church. Sipho was disappointed about these troubles. She thought that when she became a Christian her troubles would end.

If you could talk to Sipho, what would you tell her? _____

WEEK 8: JESUS IS THE TRUE VINE
DAY 4: KEEP THEM FROM THE EVIL ONE
John 17:1-26.

1. This week we have been learning what Jesus does for us as the vine. He gives us life. He helps us bear fruit. He calls us friends. We can ask God for help in His name.

Although they would have His peace, what did Jesus say the disciples would have in the world because they were united with Him? _____

At the end of John 16, what did He say about the world to encourage them? _____

2. Jesus said they would have troubles. He said: I have overcome the world. Today we will see that Jesus prayed for us. His prayer is written in John 17. It is the longest prayer of Jesus in the Bible. Many people call the prayer which Jesus taught the disciples "The Lord's prayer." But Jesus was not praying then. He was teaching others to pray. Today we will see the prayer which Jesus Himself prayed.

- (1) In John 17 Jesus asked the Father to give Him glory so He could give the Father glory.
- (2) Jesus prayed that we may be one. Then instead of asking that we be taken out of the world, He prayed that we would be kept from the Evil One.

Take your Bible now and read John 17:1 to 8. Who was praying this prayer?

=====

3. Jesus was praying it. It is the longest written prayer of Jesus. The whole chapter is the words of Jesus as He spoke to the Father. Jesus prayed for Himself and He prayed for us. He wanted glory so He could give it to the Father.

John 17:1:

... he looked up to heaven and said, "Father, the hour has come.

What do you think Jesus meant when He said: The hour has come? _____

=====

4. Jesus had been telling the disciples that He would die now. It seems that this is the hour He was talking about. Now He was praying to His Father about this. We should always pray before something important is to happen.

John 17:1:

... Give glory to your Son, so that the Son may give glory to you.

What did Jesus want to give to His Father? _____

=====

5. Jesus wanted to give His Father glory. He wanted to do this through His disciples. The prayer of Jesus is very interesting. In verses 1 to 5 Jesus prayed for Himself. In verse 9 to 26 Jesus prayed for His followers. This can teach us something. Jesus took five verses to pray for Himself. He took 18 verses to pray for others. We can make a picture of it like this.

Jesus prayed for Himself this long: _____

Jesus prayed for others this long: _____

In your prayers, who gets more time? Is it yourself or others? _____

6. It is good if you spend more time praying for others than for yourself. Jesus spent more time praying for others in this prayer. Jesus cared about His disciples, whom He called friends. He prayed for them after He prayed for Himself.

John 17:4:

I have shown your glory on earth; I have finished the work you gave me to do.

What did Jesus want the Father to give Him, so He could give glory to the Father?

=====

7. Jesus wanted the Father to give Him glory. He wanted the same glory which He had before the world was made. Remember what we learned. Before the world was made Jesus was here. He was God and He made all things. Now Jesus wanted to receive back His glory as God. Perhaps you also remember what Jesus said when the greek people came to see him.

John 12:23:

The hour has now come for the Son of Man to receive great glory.

What would Jesus do with the glory which He received? _____

=====

8. He would give it to the Father. Jesus went on talking to the greeks. He explained that if a grain of wheat dies, it produces many grains. Jesus would get much glory through His death and resurrection. He would be seen as God. And would save many lives. Then Jesus prayed.

John 12:28:

Father, bring glory to your name.

In His prayer in John 17 why did Jesus ask the Father to give Him glory?_____

=====

9. Jesus prayed for glory so He could give glory to the Father. Jesus would get much glory through His followers. So He prayed much for them.

John 17:8:

I gave them the message that you gave me, and they received it; they know that it is true that I came from you, and they believe that you sent me.

In this chapter, did Jesus pray more for Himself, or for others?_____

=====

10. He prayed more for others. He prayed many things for His disciples. He prayed that God would keep them safe from the Evil One.

John 17:9:

I pray for them. I do not pray for the world but for those you gave me, for they belong to you.

In His prayer in John 17, why did Jesus ask the Father to give Him glory?_____

=====

11. Jesus asked this so He could give glory to the Father. We too should want to give glory to God. We should not want glory so people think we are great. When people see our lives, it should help them praise God. Jesus prayed most of His prayer for His disciples. He was also praying for us. He prayed that we would be kept safe from the Evil One.

In your Bible read John 17:9 to 15. In verse 10, through whom would God's glory be shown? _____

=====

12. It would be shown through the disciples. This means all His followers. It means us too. Jesus prayed for all of us. He was concerned for us. Jesus knew we would have to live in this world. Jesus was going to live with His Father. His disciples would be left in this world. So He prayed for them.

John 17:11:

And now I am coming to you; I am no longer in the world, but they are in the world. Holy Father! Keep them safe by the power of your name, the name you gave me, so that they may be one just as you and I are one.

From this verse, for what purpose did Jesus want His followers to be kept safe?

=====

13. Jesus wanted them to be kept safe so they would be one. He wanted them to be one as the Father and He were one. Many times in this prayer Jesus asked that His followers would be united. Perhaps you learned about this in the book called, **Life of Christ, Part 2**.

The other day a man asked me, "Why are there so many different churches? Are you in competition with one another?" I said, "No, we are all one in Christ."

John 17:12:

While I was with them, I kept them safe by the power of your name, the name you gave me. I protected them (or kept them safe).

Who was Jesus keeping safe from the Evil One? _____

=====

14. He was keeping His disciples safe. Now He was praying for them. He was praying for all believers. Jesus knew that He was about to die. Then He would go back to His Father.

17:13:

And now I am coming to you, and I say these thing in the world so that they might have my joy in their hearts in all its fullness.

Did Jesus ask that the believers be taken out of the world? _____

=====

15. He did not ask that they be taken out. He does not ask us to be taken out of the world today. But He asks for something else.

John 17:14-15:

I gave them your message, and the world hated them, because they do not belong to the world, just as I do not belong to the world. I do not ask you to take them out of the world, but I do ask you to keep them safe from the Evil One.

Jesus asked that we be kept safe from whom? _____

=====

16. He wants us kept safe from the Evil One. Jesus knew that His followers must stay on in the world for a while. They must learn to fight against Satan. They must learn to witness to others about Jesus. Some people try to separate themselves too much from the world. Some Christians try to live by themselves in certain places. They do not want to work or talk with people who are not Christians. But the Evil One can still tempt them there.

Jesus prayed that we may be one. Then instead of asking that we be taken out of the world, what did He ask? _____

=====

17. He asked that we be kept from the Evil One. Jesus wants us to be here in the world. He said that we are that salt of the earth. In order to make food taste good, the salt must be in it. Jesus also said that we must be His witnesses. In order to tell the good news, we must be with the people who need it. But we must turn away from the temptations of Satan. God will help us do this. Satan has power, but God has greater power.
