1. Greetings to you in the name of our wonderful Lord. In this book we shall go on with the study of the Old Testament. We receive help from the things we read in the Old Testament. Also, the Old Testament helps us to understand the New Testament.

2. There are some things in the Old Testament which are not easy to understand. But we are happy if you enjoy reading it. It can help you in many ways, as we shall see. I like to read the Old Testament.

There are 39 books in the Old Testament. In Looking at the Old Testament, Part 3, we shall study the books of poetry or songs. Today we shall learn:

The books of songs are found in the third part of the Old Testament after the books of history.

- (4) Books of prophets

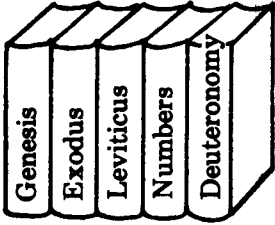

4. Books of history come before the books of songs. The books of history finish with the books of Esther. These books tell what the people of Israel did as God led them. Then come the books of songs. There are many things the people wanted to remember about God. So they made songs about them.

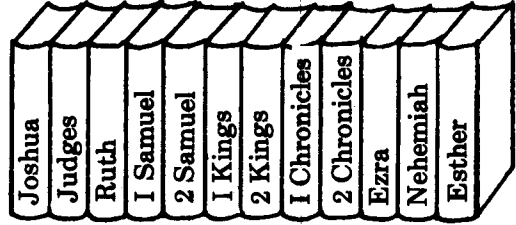

5. They are in the Old Testament. Let us see all the books of the Old Testament. We can see what kinds of books they are.

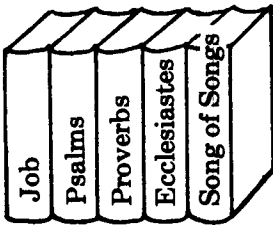

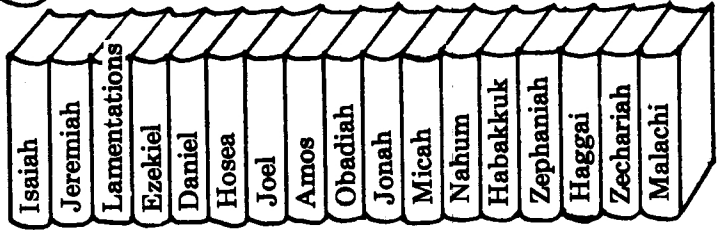

6. There are five books of songs. They are: (1) Job, (2) Psalms, (3) Proverbs, (4) Ecclesiastes, (5) Song of Songs.

Are the books of songs in the first, second, or third part of the Old Testament?

7. They come after the books of law and the books of history. So they are in the third part. In Africa today, schools and churches write songs and put them into books. Some of the songs tell about great men who have helped their people. Some songs help people learn to work together to build up their country. Some songs praise God for helping the people build a new church. Or they praise Him for some other part of His glory.

Do you think songs can help people face hard things with a brave heart?

8. You might have answered Yes or No. But I often find that singing helps me. I like to sing songs about God. Often the songs which our people write today are about things which are happening now. They are about things which are happening near us. Some songs tell about things which our fathers have told us.

There is one big difference between the songs of our fathers and the songs of the Old Testament. The books of songs in the Bible were written by men whom God told to write. They were led in a special way by the Holy Spirit. Their writings are the word of God.

9. It is good if some of these songs are written down. They can help us to understand our people. But remember that they are only the words of men. The songs in the Bible are the word of God. Think about the different kinds of books in the Bible.

But God has always kept His word safe. We have it now because He kept it for us. Other Christians have brought it to us. God wants us to hide His word in our hearts so we are kept from sin. He also wants us to share it with other people.

DAY 2: FIVE BOOKS OF SONGS

1. There are 39 books in the Old Testament. These are divided into four kinds. What kind of books are found in the third part of the Old Testament, after the books of history?

2. They are the books of songs. Sometimes they are called the books of poetry. All peoples have special ways of telling what they feel. They put together certain words and teach them to others. Sometimes they sing these words. Sometimes they speak them in proverbs. There are five books in the Old Testament called books of songs.

- (1) Job
- (2) Psalms
- (3) Proverbs
- (4) Ecclesiastes
- (5) Song of Songs

Which one of these five books do you read most often?

3. Perhaps you said Psalms or Proverbs. Many people like to read these two books. But all of the books can help us.

How many books are there in the part of the Old Testament called books of songs?

4. There are five books of songs. These five books tell us the thoughts and feelings of the people of Israel. Let us notice again that they are (1) Job, (2) Psalms, (3) Proverbs, (4) Ecclesiastes, and (5) Songs of Songs.

Think about the songs of your people. Perhaps they have been handed down for many years. They may be praise songs for a great fighter, or they may be songs which women sing as they work in the fields. The first book of songs in the Bible is called Job. It was written about a man in great trouble.

If you can, write a few words from one of the harvest songs of your people.

5. Perhaps we can share these in class. Some of these songs may not speak of good things. But others tell the feelings of the people in a good way.

The people of Israel had many songs. A few of the songs are written in the books of history. But most of the songs are written in the books of songs.

6. The book of Job is the first one. It tells us about a man who suffered very much. But he kept a strong faith in God. The other four books are Psalms, Proverbs, Ecclesiastes, and Song of Songs.

The order in which these books come in the Bible was fixed by men. So perhaps they do not come in the order of their age. The book of Job may be very old. We are not sure when it was written, but this is not important. The important thing is that we are sure it is God's word. God led the writer.

2 Peter 1:21:

Men moved by the Holy Spirit spoke from God.

7. There are five books of songs. The first is Job and the second is Psalms. The book of Psalms was not written by one person alone. It may be that many people helped to write these songs, but many of them were written by David. They are songs about God's wonderful creation. They also tell about worship, repenting, thanksgiving, and praise. We shall learn much about these songs.

The third book is called Proverbs. In this book are many wise sayings. Solomon wrote most of them. He wrote them to show people how to live wisely before God and man. Most people also think that Solomon wrote Ecclesiastes and Song of Songs.

8. It is the third part called the books of songs. The songs are different from our songs today, but the people of Israel read or sang them. They used them at the places of worship and in their homes.

The fourth book of songs is Ecclesiastes. In it the writer asks: What is the most important thing in life?

9. Most people think that Solomon wrote Proverbs, Ecclesiastes, and Song of Songs.

There are five books of songs in the Old Testament. I have written the first and last ones. You write the other three, in right order.

10. The books are (1) Job, (2) Psalms, (3) Proverbs, (4) Ecclesiastes, and (5) Song of Songs.

The last book, Song of Songs, is not easy to understand. There are many thoughts about this book. Most Christians think it is a story about Christ's love. It was written to teach us a lesson for our hearts. It teaches about the love Christ has for His church.

DAY 3: GOD CALLED JOB A BLAMELESS MAN

1. We are learning about the third part of the Old Testament.

2. The books of songs are Job, Psalms, Proverbs, Ecclesiastes, and Song of Songs. Today we are beginning our study of the book of Job. We will study this book for three weeks.

Many parts of the book of Job are written as songs. The big thought in the whole book is the problem of man's suffering. In today's lesson we will learn that God called Job a blameless man because:

(1) Job honoured God.

(2) He obeyed God.

Take your Bible now and read Job 1:1 to 5. Read verse 1 again. From this verse, what kind of man was Job? Was he good or bad? _____

3. He was a good man. He honoured God. He feared Him. It was not the kind of fear that made Job want to run away from God. It was respect. Job always trusted and obeyed God. And God called Job a blameless man. To be blameless means to have no spot or sin.

Many years later when God wanted a good example for Ezekiel, He spoke of Job. God said this about Job and other great men.

Ezekiel 14:14:

even if these three men, Noah, Daniel, and Job were in it, they would deliver but their own lives by their righteousness, says the Lord.

Do you know some people who honor God truly? _____

4. I am sure you said Yes. Here in Africa, we say a child is very good if he honours and obeys his father. We expect children to respect older people. When they do this, the older people know they are good children.

We have seen two reasons why God called Job a blameless man. Whom did Job honour more than anyone else? _____

5. One reason why God called Job a blameless man was that he honoured God. Job could not be perfect in his body or his mind. Since the sin of Adam in the beginning, our bodies are not perfect. But Job's love for God was blameless. He loved God with a perfect heart. God calls us today to honour Him with a perfect heart. We should honour Him by loving, respecting and worshipping Him.

How should a person honour God in his worship? To answer this question, open your Bible to John 4:24. Copy the verse here.

6. We see from John 4 what true worship is. We must worship God in spirit, or from our hearts. We must worship Him in truth, not just with our words. Some people try to honour God, but they continue to do evil. This is not possible if a person wants to please God. We see in Job 1 that Job did two very important things.

Job 1:1:

There was a man in the land of Uz, whose name was Job; and that man was blameless and upright, one who feared or honoured God, and turned away from evil.

God called Job a blameless man because:

7. Arap Cheres is a man of the Kalenjini tribe in Kenya. He calls his first-born child very good because he honours his father. God called Job a blameless man, first, because he honoured God.

Second, he called Job blameless because he obeyed God. Job turned away from everything that was sinful. He tried always to do right things and to turn his back on wrong things. We who are God's children today should honour God. Job did this.

Do you think a person can please God if he sometimes cheats and breaks God's laws?

8. We are sure God wants us to keep His laws, as Job did. God tells you and me today to turn from sin. He tells us to work for Him. He wants us to help other people know Christ as their Saviour. Think of what John wrote about this in the New Testament.

John 14:21:

He who has my commandments and keeps them, he it is who loves me; and he who loves me will be loved by my Father, and I will love him and manifest myself to him.

From this verse, who is it who loves and honours God? _____

9. It is the one who has God's commandments and keeps them. In our study today we see a person in the Old Testament whom God called a blameless man. He called him blameless because he honoured God and obeyed Him.

Who was that man? _____

10. That man was Job.

What was the second reason why God called him a blameless man?

11. Job obeyed God. Job had many possessions. He also had seven sons and three daughters. He offered sacrifices to God for his family. He got up early in the morning to worship God.

It is very important that you and I talk with God in the early morning. The first important thing each day is to have our hearts happy in the Lord. We should talk with Him before we talk with other members of our family. We should worship Him before we do business with our neighbours and friends. Only God can prepare our hearts for the new day.

Job 1:5:

and he (Job) would rise early in the morning and offer burnt offerings.

When did Job offer sacrifices to God?

12. Job worshipped God early in the morning. He could not obey God unless he had God's help.

Because Job honoured God and obeyed Him, God called Job what kind of man?

13. God saw Job's great love for Him. He called Job a blameless man. This is what God said to Satan about Job.

Job 1:8:

"Have you considered my servant Job, that there is none like him on the earth, a blameless and upright man, who fears God and turns away from evil?"

Job offered sacrifices to God for his children. He had seven sons and three daughters. We shall see what happened to these children.

Why did God call Job a blameless man?

14. Job honoured God. He also obeyed God. Job made sacrifices to God in order to cleanse his children. Sometimes African people still follow the traditions of their tribe. They offer sacrifices. They do this as part of their worship.

Christians accept Jesus as the final sacrifice. Jesus gave His life for us on the cross. We no longer need to make sacrifices for sins.

Job 1:5:

Job would send and sanctify them, and he would rise early in the morning and offer burnt offerings according to the number of them all; for Job said, "It may be that my sons have sinned, and cursed God in their hearts." Thus did Job continually.

Think carefully about this. Did Job worship God only sometimes, or day after day?

15. Job loved God. He worshipped Him day after day. He had many tests and troubles.

He often suffered much. But as we read the whole book of Job we see that he continued to do right. He did the things which caused God to call him a blameless man.

DAY 4: SATAN IS THE ENEMY OF THE SOULS OF MEN

1. As we begin a new lesson, let us think of what we learned yesterday.

Why did God call Job a blameless man?

2. God called Job a blameless man because Job honoured God and obeyed Him.

But there is someone who does not like to see people serving God. From the book of Job we see that Satan often goes before God. There he speaks lies about God's children. Job served God with a perfect heart. Satan was so unhappy that he went to God and spoke against Job. Today we shall learn that:

(1) Satan is the enemy of the souls of men.

(2) God can defeat this enemy for us.

Take your Bible now and read Job 1:6 to 12. Read verse 6 again. When the angels of God came to the Lord, there was a wicked spirit with them. What was his name?

3. This wicked spirit was Satan. In the beginning Satan was an angel of God. But he was very proud. He wanted to be higher than God. Because of this, he was put out of heaven.

Revelation 12:9:

And the great dragon was thrown down, that ancient (or old) serpent (or snake), who is called the Devil and Satan, the deceiver of the world -- he was thrown down to the earth, and his angels were thrown down with him.

From this verse, Satan was not put out of heaven alone. Who were put out with him?

4. Satan and his angels were put out of heaven. From this we see that there are good angels and bad angels. God has angels who serve Him. But Satan also has his angels.

Satan works very hard. We know how he deceived Eve in the Garden of Eden. He was not happy to see Adam and Eve obeying God. Satan's words to Eve sounded very good and she did what he said. But Satan deceived her.

Do words that sound good always show that the person who says them has a good heart?

5. Satan's words sounded good but they were not. His heart was full of evil. Sometimes today people say words that sound good, but they are not true. They deceive people.

Satan was angry when he saw that Job lived for God with a blameless heart.

Was this the first time Satan had been unhappy to see a person serving God?

6. No, Satan had been unhappy with Adam and Eve. He is the enemy of the souls of all people. He wants to deceive them. He tells lies.

John 8:44:

There is no truth in him (Satan). When he lies, he speaks according to his own nature, for he is a liar and the father of lies.

We have seen that Satan does not work alone. Who does he have to help him?

7. Satan has his angels to help him. He is our enemy because he tells lies and deceives people. He is clever in an evil way. He even tried to tempt Jesus to bow down and worship him, but Jesus refused.

Who is the enemy of the souls of men? _____

8. The Bible tells us that Satan is a liar and the father of lies. He is the enemy of our souls. Satan has great power. He is God's enemy and he is our enemy. He is the ruler of this world. Perhaps these words make you feel afraid. But let us remember that there are two kingdoms. There is the kingdom of God or of heaven. There is the kingdom of Satan or of this world. Satan wanted Jesus to bow down to him. But remember what Jesus said.

Matthew 4:10:

Then Jesus said to him, "Begone, Satan! for it is written, 'You shall worship the Lord your God and Him only shall you serve.'"

When Jesus was tempted by Satan, did he obey Satan or did he obey God?

9. Jesus refused to obey Satan. He chose to obey God. Jesus defeated Satan by using the word of God. We too can choose today whom we will obey. Let us see what Paul said about this.

Romans 8:2:

For the law of the Spirit of life in Christ Jesus has set me free from the law of sin and death.

From this verse, Paul found freedom from sin and death and Satan in what person?

10. Paul found victory over sin and Satan through Christ. Now let us see what James said.

James 4:7-8:

Submit yourselves therefore to God. Resist the devil and he will flee from you. Draw near to God and he will draw near to you.

Through whom does God give us victory over the enemy of our souls? _____

11. He gives us victory through Christ. Christ can defeat the enemy for us. He gave himself to die for our sins. Through His blood he won the victory. We can have this victory if we give ourselves to Him and obey His word. Christ is stronger than Satan.

God made Satan an angel, but he disobeyed God and became an enemy. Now the angel whom God made is fighting against the God who made him. But Satan has no power except what God allows him to have. Let us remember this as we study about Job. Let us remember it too when we think about our own lives.

Which kingdom is greater? Is it the kingdom of God or the kingdom of Satan?

12. I am sure you said the kingdom of God is greater. Satan is stronger than we are. If we trust our own strength, he will defeat us. But God is stronger than Satan. If we trust God, he will defeat Satan for us. But we must do something. We must trust the blood of Christ, the son of God, to save us. And we must tell others about our faith in God.

Revelation 12:11:

And they have conquered him (Satan) by the blood of the Lamb (Christ) and by the word of their testimony.

From the book of Job who is the enemy of the souls of men? _____

13. The enemy of our souls is Satan and we must run from him. God can defeat this enemy for us.

Pastor Ezekiel worked hard to help his people. He visited those who were sick. He encouraged and comforted others. He prayed much and preached every Sunday under some trees. Sometimes it rained during the meeting, so Pastor Ezekiel and his people began to build a church. This made the witch doctor angry. He told Pastor Ezekiel that he would curse him if he kept on building. He would cause evil to come on the Christians.

But the Christians prayed and kept on working. The witch doctor was not able to bring any harm to them. He became afraid because he saw the power of prayer.

Who gave the Christians power to defeat Satan? _____

14. God gave them the victory. He will always give us victory if we trust Him. Some people are very much afraid of a curse. If they know a wicked person wants to curse them, they lose hope. They say, "There is nothing we can do." Then Satan defeats them.

A Christian should say, "I belong to God. I will not let Satan take away my faith. I will pray and trust God." Then God will give him a heart that is strong and brave. Satan and his angels cannot defeat God.

Which kingdom do you want to belong to -- the kingdom of God or the kingdom of Satan?

15. I am sure you said the kingdom of God. We can praise God as Job did.

Job 42:2:

I know that thou canst do all things, and that no purpose of thine can be thwarted (or defeated).

DAY 5: JOB'S FIRST GREAT TEST

1. From the book of Job, who is the enemy of the souls of men? _____
Who can defeat this enemy for us? _____

2. We have seen that Satan is a liar. He deceives people. He is the enemy of the souls of men. God can defeat him for us. God's kingdom is greater than Satan's kingdom. Job understood this, though he did not understand why God was allowing him to be tested. Today we shall learn:

Job's faith in God remained strong even when he lost everything he had.

Take your Bible now and read Job 1:13 to 22. Keep your Bible open. From yesterday's lesson, who caused all these hard things to come to Job?

3. God had allowed Satan to test Job. Satan caused all the hard things to come. Satan said he had been walking about on the earth. He always does this. He tempts God's children and tries to make them lose their faith in God. God knew that Satan had seen the very good life of a certain man.

Job 1:8:

And the Lord said to Satan, "Have you considered my servant Job, that there is none like him on the earth, a blameless (or perfect) and upright man, who fears God and turns away from evil?"

What man did God say was his true servant? _____

4. God knew that Job was his faithful servant. But Satan refused to believe this. Satan accused Job of serving God only because of the blessings God gave him. Satan said Job would curse God if God took away his good things. God allowed Satan to test Job.

Job 1:12:

And the Lord said to Satan, "Behold, all that he has is in your power; only upon himself (or on his body) do not put forth your hand."

Did God allow Satan to do everything he wanted, or did God refuse to let him do some things to Job?

5. At first, God did not allow Satan to touch Job's body. God put a fence around Satan. Satan cannot touch God's children unless God agrees. Now we see the first great test of Job's strong faith in God.

Job 1:14-15:

And there came a messenger to Job, and said, "The oxen were plowing and the asses feeding beside them; and the Sabeans fell upon them and took them, and slew (or killed) the servants with the edge of the sword; and I alone have escaped to tell you."

Did Job have strong faith in the things he had, or did he have strong faith in God?

6. The tests which Satan brought to Job were very difficult. But Job had strong faith in God.

The Sabeans were people who went about stealing animals. They took them quickly into the desert. It was impossible to go and find them. The Sabeans took away all of Job's oxen and donkeys. They killed all of his servants except one.

Have you ever had someone steal your ox or donkey? _____

7. Perhaps you said Yes. I am sure that was a hard time for you. But Job's faith was not in his oxen or his donkeys. It was not in his sheep.

Job 1:16:

While he was yet speaking, there came another, and said, "The fire of God fell from heaven and burned up the sheep and the servants, and consumed them; and I alone have escaped to tell you."

Job's faith was in whom? _____

Was Job's faith weak or strong? _____

8. Job's faith was in God. And his faith was strong. But Satan was not yet finished testing his faith. Job also had camels. Camels are big animals used for carrying heavy loads.

Job 1:17:

While he was yet speaking, there came another, and said, "The Chaldeans formed three companies, and made a raid upon the camels and took them, and slew the servants with the edge of the sword; and I alone have escaped to tell you."

Before all this happened, was Job rich or poor? _____

9. Yesterday you read that he had:
7,000 sheep
3,000 camels
500 yoke of oxen
500 donkeys
Very many servants

Now all of these things were gone. The camels were probably carrying heavy loads of things which Job was selling. These things were gone too. This was a great loss.

God had blessed Job with many good things. Was Satan happy to see Job serving God with a strong faith? _____

Is Satan happy to see anyone serving God with strong faith today? _____

10. Of course Satan is never happy to see anyone following God. It was hard for Job to lose so many things in such a short time. The Bible says that while one messenger was speaking, the next one arrived. The last report was worst of all.

Think about yourself. Which do you love more -- your things or your children?

11. I am sure that you love your children more than your things. The last messenger gave a very sad report to Job.

Job 1:18-19:

there came another, and said, "Your sons and daughter were eating and drinking wine in their eldest brother's house; and behold, a great wind came across the wilderness, and struck the four corners of the house, and it fell upon the young people, and they are dead; and I alone have escaped to tell you.

In your Bible read Job 1:2. How many sons did Job have? _____

12. Job's seven sons and three daughters were all killed at once. What did Job do when he heard all the reports? He first tore his clothes and cut off all his hair. In those days, that was a way of showing great sorrow. Then Job fell on the ground and worshipped God. Job had strong faith in God. His faith remained strong even when he lost everything he had.

13. I am sure you felt very sad. Sometimes we lose our houses by fire. Sometimes people steal our things. Sometimes a friend or one of our family dies. But we have not heard of another person who lost so much so suddenly as Job did. But still Job worshipped God.

What did Job have in God that remained strong even when he lost everything he had?

14. Job had faith that remained strong. He did not sin. Satan had said that Job would curse God. But instead Job worshipped God. This defeated Satan. Job said that God had given him everything he had. If God wanted to take it away, that was all right. Job's faith in God remained strong even when he lost everything he had.

Someone may say that it is wrong for a person to be rich. It is not wrong to be rich like Job, but a person must always remember that God has given him his riches. He must love God more than he loves his riches.

Who was defeated, was it Job or Satan?

15. Satan was defeated when Job worshipped God.

Job 1:21-22:

And he said, "Naked I came from my mother's womb, and naked shall I return; the Lord gave, and the Lord has taken away; blessed be the name of the Lord. In all this Job did not sin or charge God with wrong.

What did Job have that remained strong even when he lost everything he had?

16. Job had faith that remained strong. He loved God with a perfect heart. That was why he could still worship God. He could worship even when everything he had was destroyed.

If hard things come to me, I may do something like this:

- (1) I may say many sharp words which I will later be sorry for.
- (2) I may become angry and refuse to talk.
- (3) I may stop working for God or say that I will stop.
- (4) I may take time for quiet prayer, talking with God and letting him talk with me.

Three of these are wrong things to do. Only one is good. Write the good thing here:
