

## **WEEK 3: MORE OF JOB**

### **DAY 1: GOD HEARS EVEN WHEN HE IS SILENT**

1. Greetings to you at the beginning of our third week. This week we shall finish our study of the book of Job. Before we go on let us remember the last day's lesson.

2. God receives glory when we suffer patiently. Suffering makes our faith strong. And suffering prepares us to help others. God allowed Job to suffer for these reasons. He allowed Satan to test Job. But God was watching all the time. Today we shall learn:

Take your Bible now and read Job 38:1 to 7. Read verse 1 again. Who began to talk to Job at this time?

3. The Lord began to talk to Job. Job's troubles were very great. They had continued for a long time. The people who visited him added more troubles. Job prayed to God but it seemed that God was not listening to him. Job was in great need.

Did God answer Job's prayers immediately, or was God silent for a while?

4. God did not answer immediately. He was silent. But He was hearing his child, Job, all the time. God always hears and understands His children.

Do we sometimes become impatient when God does not answer our prayers quickly?

5. I think we do. It is easy for us to become impatient. Sometimes we begin to doubt. We think our prayers are not being heard.

Who is hearing the prayers of His children, even when He is silent?

6. Even when He is silent, God is hearing His children. He knew all about Job. He understood every bit of his sorrow and pain. He cared that Job had to suffer. At last, He came to Job in a strong wind, and talked with him. First God said that Job had spoken many words about things he did not know. God began to ask Job some questions.

We people of Africa often begin talking by asking questions, don't we? \_\_\_\_\_

7. God knew that it was the right time to talk to Job. God asked questions that showed that He is great and Job was small. God asked questions like these:

Where were you when I created the earth? (Job 38:4)

Have you ever told the sun when to rise? (Job 38:12)

Do you know where the doors of death are? (Job 38:17)

Who makes the wild donkeys wild? (Job 39:5)

Do you still want to argue with me? (Job 40:2)

Even when God is silent, He is hearing whom? \_\_\_\_\_

8. He is doing this to His children. Job was His faithful child. God waited until He knew it was the right time. Then He answered Job.

Even when God is silent, He is doing what to His children? \_\_\_\_\_

9. God is hearing His children even when He is silent. This was true in Job's day. It is still true in our day. Jesus was speaking to His followers when He said this:

Matthew 21:22:

And whatever you ask in prayer, you will receive, if you have faith.

Does God always answer our prayers right away, or is He sometimes silent for a while? \_\_\_\_\_

10. God is sometimes silent for a while. Let us see what happened to the prophet Daniel. He prayed for 21 days. Then an angel of God came with a message.

Daniel 10:12:

Fear not, Daniel, for from the first day that you set your mind to understand and humbled yourself before your God, your words have been heard, and I have come because of your words.

From this verse, on which day did God begin to hear Daniel's prayer? \_\_\_\_\_

11. God heard Daniel's prayer on the first day that he prayed. But Daniel had to be patient. He had to continue to trust God until God answered.

Job sometimes became impatient for a short time. But he never cursed God. Soon his faith returned. Then he waited with great patience.

On which day do you think God began to hear Job's prayers? \_\_\_\_\_

12. I think you said the first day. But God did not answer Job right away. He knows what is best for us. He cares for us. He wants our faith to be strong. So he allows us to be tested.

Even when God is silent, what is He doing for His children? \_\_\_\_\_

13. He is hearing them, even when He is silent. He knows their troubles. He knows their pain. He will answer when He sees that the time is right. We must continue to pray with faith.

James 1:3:

For you know that the testing of your faith produces steadfastness (or patience).

Who hears His children but sometimes remains silent for a while? \_\_\_\_\_

14. Sometimes God is silent for a while. This is because He knows what is best for us. He wants us to learn to trust Him. He wants us to be patient. God loves us. God loved Job.

God waited a while to answer Job's prayer. Had God forgotten Job? \_\_\_\_\_

Does God ever forget us? \_\_\_\_\_

The people in your church need to understand this. Perhaps they are having hard things just now. Prepare a sermon to preach from this lesson. On another paper write the big things you will say. Preach the sermon if you can. Bring the paper to class.

15. God never forgot Job and He never forgets us.

## **WEEK 3: MORE OF JOB**

### **DAY 2: JOB RECEIVED A GREAT REWARD**

1. Job suffered a long time. It seemed as if God had forgotten him, but He had not.

From the lessons of Job, if God's children cry to Him, what is He doing, even when He is silent?

---

2. Even when God is silent, He is hearing His children. Job could not understand why he was suffering, but God understood. God permitted Satan to do his evil work for a while. Then God said it was enough. Job had remained faithful and God rewarded him. Today we shall learn:

- (1) After the time of testing God told Job to pray for his sinful friends.
- (2) When our faith continues like Job's God always leads us to great reward.

Take your Bible now and read Job 42:7 to 17. Did God leave Job in trouble forever?

---

3. He did not leave Job in trouble. He knows when we have had enough. In the New Testament, Paul explained this.

I Corinthians 10:13:

No temptation has overtaken you that is not common to man. God is faithful, and he will not let you be tempted beyond your strength, but with the temptation will also provide the way of escape, that you may be able to endure it.

Paul says who will not allow you to be tempted beyond your strength?

---

4. When we trust Him, God will not allow us to be tempted beyond our strength. He wants to lead us to a great reward. It was like that with Job. God talked with Job. Job covered his mouth and did not try to answer God. Because he was humble, God led him to a great reward. This what Job said.

Job 42:3:

I have uttered (or said) what I did not understand, things too wonderful for me, which I did not know.

Do you sometimes see that you have said things you did not really know?

5. Perhaps all people do this sometimes. But God wants to teach us to depend on Him and keep our faith strong. He wants us to love Him. God was angry with Eliphaz, Bildad and Zophar because their words were not true. God commanded them to offer sacrifices. Then God said a very surprising thing.

Job 42:7-8:

you have not spoken of me what is right, as my servant Job has. Now therefore take seven bulls and seven rams, and go to my servant Job, and offer up for yourselves a burnt offering; and my servant Job shall pray for you, for I will accept his prayer not to deal with you according to your folly.

Who did God say would pray for Eliphaz, Bildad and Zophar? \_\_\_\_\_

6. God said that Job would pray for them.

Job 42:9:

So Eliphaz the Temanite and Bildad the Shuhite and Zophar the Naamathite went and did what the Lord had told them; and the Lord accepted Job's prayer.

Did the three men obey God? \_\_\_\_\_

Did Job pray for his spiritual enemies? \_\_\_\_\_

7. Both of these answers are Yes. Think what a big thing Job did! These men had accused him of many bad things. They had said that they were Job's friends. But Satan used them to become his spiritual enemies.

Is it easy or difficult for you to pray for your enemies? \_\_\_\_\_

---

8. Many Christians find it difficult to pray for their enemies. God helped Job to love his friends who had troubled him. God wanted to lead Job to a great reward.

Job 42:10:

And the Lord restored (or made good again) the fortunes of Job, when he prayed for his friends; and the Lord gave Job twice as much as he had before.

How much did God give back to Job? \_\_\_\_\_

9. God gave back to Job twice as much as he had. God gave him riches and happiness. God did this because Job had kept his faith during the years of suffering.

After the time of testing what did God tell Job to do for his sinful friends?

10. God told Job to pray for them. The friends made sacrifices for themselves. Then Job prayed for them. God accepted his prayer and began to give back blessings to Job.

Job 42:12:

And the Lord blessed the latter (or last) days of Job more than his beginning; and he had fourteen thousand sheep, six thousand camels, a thousand yoke of oxen, and a thousand she-asses (or donkeys). He had also seven sons and three daughters.

Do you think Job trusted God because he wanted a reward, or because he loved God?  
\_\_\_\_\_

11. If you said it was because he loved God, you are thinking well. Job did not know that he would get such a great reward. So he did not trust God because he wanted a reward. Remember that he said he would trust God even if he killed him.

We too should trust God because we love Him. When we trust God, He will either take away our troubles, or else He will give us strength to bear them. He answers our prayers as He sees best. And when our faith continues like Job's, God always leads us to great reward.

Are things difficult for you at the present time? \_\_\_\_\_

12. If they are, God knows and understands. He hears your prayers. He led Job to a great reward. He led Job to blessings in this life. He also led him to the reward of eternal life. Remember that as Job was tested he became more sure that he would see God.

When our faith continues like Job's, does God give us a small reward or a great reward?

13. It will be great. God cannot reward a person who has no faith. We must trust Him and accept what He sends for our lives. When we allow God to rule our lives completely. He will reward us.

Job 42:10-11:

And the Lord gave Job twice as much as he had before. Then came to him all his brothers and sisters and all who had known him before, and ate bread with him in his house; and they showed him sympathy and comforted him for all the evil that the Lord had brought upon him.

When did Job's relatives come to comfort him? \_\_\_\_\_

14. They came after God gave back Job's riches. God gave him great reward. His relatives had not come when Job needed them. But Job did not hate them. He received them in a kind way.

When our faith continues like Job's what does God always lead us to?

15. When we are faithful, God always leads us to great reward. God gave back Job's riches. He also gave more sons and daughters to Job. Notice that Job's daughters received part of their father's riches just as the sons did.

Do daughters in your part of Africa receive a part of the inheritance? \_\_\_\_\_

16. Among most people in East Africa, the daughters do not receive an inheritance. It goes to the eldest son. Discuss in class whether you agree with what Job did.

After the time of testing, what did God tell Job to do for his sinful friends?

When our faith continues like Job's, what does God always lead us to?

17. God told Job to pray for his friends. When our faith continues, God always leads us to great reward. Job lived for many years and was very rich. God does not always give us riches. But He always gives us salvation when we receive Christ. He gives us His peace and joy. These are parts of our reward now. Then He has promised us eternal life in heaven if we continue to walk with Him. This is our future reward.

Mark 13:13:

But he who endures to the end will be saved.

Does God give us rewards now, or does He wait and reward us only in heaven?

18. He gives us many rewards now. He gives us more than we are able to count. He does this because of His great love for us.

After the time of testing, what did God tell Job to do for his sinful friends?

## WEEK 3: MORE OF JOB

### DAY 3: JESUS ANSWERED JOB'S QUESTIONS

1. We have seen that God does many good things for us because He loves us. After the time of testing, what did God tell Job to do for his sinful friends?

2. God told Job to pray for his sinful friends. When our faith continues, God always gives us great reward. Job asked many questions while he was suffering. His three friends were not able to give him the right answers. Now we have the New Testament. In the New Testament, Jesus explained many things from the Old Testament. Today we will learn answers to three questions Job asked.

- (1) God's answer to the question about a middle-man is: Jesus is the only middle-man for God and man.
- (2) Jesus' answer to the question about rising from the dead is: I am the resurrection and the life.
- (3) Jesus' answer to the question about where to find God is: He who has seen me has seen the Father.

Who had gone to God and accused Job? \_\_\_\_\_

3. Satan had permission from God to test Job. We have learned about Job's suffering. Job tried to question God. But in the end he realized that he was too small. God was too great. He could not defend himself before God. Job needed a middle-man. A middle-man is one who speaks to someone for someone else. Job needed a middle-man to speak to God for him. He could not answer God's wisdom.

Do you think that a man can understand all of God's wisdom? \_\_\_\_\_

4. I am sure you said that a man cannot understand all the wisdom of God. Job was a man. He was not great enough to question God. But only God could answer Job's questions. Let us see Job's words about this, and God's answer in the New Testament.

Job 9:33:

There is no umpire (or middle-man) between us who might lay his hand upon us both (God and Job).

I Timothy 2:5:

There is one mediator (or middle-man) between God and men, the man Christ Jesus.

Who gave Paul and others the wisdom to write that Jesus is the only middle-man between God and men?

5. God gave this wisdom through the Holy Spirit. This is how Paul knew who the middle-man is. Job learned that he could not question God. But Job continued to trust God even when he did not understand. God gave him faith to see that the middle-man would come.

Job 16:19:

Even now, behold my witness is in heaven, and he that vouches (or speaks) for me is on high.

Who is this middle-man who could answer Job's questions and go between God and men? \_\_\_\_\_

6. This is Jesus. The New Testament tells us this. It gives the answer to Job's question about someone to speak to God for him.

Hebrews 9:24:

For Christ has entered ... into heaven itself, now to appear in the presence of God on our behalf.

What do we call Jesus in His work of speaking to the Father for us? \_\_\_\_\_

7. We call Him the middle-man. This was what Job needed. Satan spoke to God about Job. But he only accused Job. He wanted to destroy him. The middle-man must save Job. The New Testament answer to Job's question about a middle-man between God and man is: Jesus is the only middle-man.

Where is Jesus now? \_\_\_\_\_

---

8. Jesus is in heaven now. He is speaking to God for us. Eliphaz had told Job that he was suffering because of his sins. Job did not have God's written word as we have today. God gave Job words to say, although Job did not fully understand them. He said: God in heaven sees me and He knows that I am not sinful. Then God let Job say that the middle-man was also alive. This was many, many years before Jesus came to earth to die for us.

What is the New Testament answer to Job's question about a middle-man between God and man? \_\_\_\_\_

9. The New Testament answer is: Jesus is the only middle-man. The second question Job asked was about rising from the dead. Jesus answered this question very clearly when he came to earth. Let us look at the verses.

Job 14:14:

If a man die, shall he live again?

John 11:25-26:

Jesus said ... "I am the resurrection and the life; he who believes in me, though he die, yet shall he live, and whoever lives and believes in me shall never die.

You have heard people talk about what will happen to them after they die. Write one of the wrong answers they give.

---

10. People who are not Christians say many things. Some say that death is the end of us. Others say that we become snakes or cows or spiders in the next life. Look at Jesus' answer again.

John 11:25:

I am the resurrection and the life.

Jesus explained that because He is the resurrection and the life, those who believe in Him will go on living. They will do this even though their bodies die.

What question did Job ask which Jesus answered in John 11:25?

---

---

11. The question was: If a man dies, will he live again? Job was in great pain and sorrow. He was thinking much about death. His friends were troubling him. Bildad told Job again that he was suffering because of his great sin. You remember that Job's faith became strong. He said, "I know that my Redeemer lives." This Redeemer was Jesus who would come. He would answer the question about rising from the dead with his words: I am the resurrection and the life.

Who asked the question about rising from the dead which Jesus answered?

12. Jesus answered Job's question. When he came, Jesus would overcome death. He explained that He would do this.

What was Jesus' answer to Job's question about rising from the dead? \_\_\_\_\_

13. Jesus' answer was: I am the resurrection and the life. Because Jesus overcame death, He could help men overcome it too. Job understood a little of this, but he did not understand all. Jesus had not yet come. Job could not understand why he must suffer. He wished that he could ask God. Job's third question was about where he could find God.

Job. 23:3:

Oh, that I knew where I might find Him (God).

John 14:9:

(Jesus said) He who has seen me has seen the Father.

No man could answer Job's questions in his day. Who answered them in the New Testament? \_\_\_\_\_

14. Jesus answered Job's questions. Eliphaz told Job to agree with God and find peace. But Job was ready to face God. It seemed to Job that God was hiding. The New Testament tells us that Jesus and the Father are one.

Jesus said that whoever has seen Him has seen whom? \_\_\_\_\_

15. Whoever has seen Jesus has seen the Father. This is what Jesus said. The way to God is through Jesus. Job did not understand this, but he had faith. He was looking forward to the day when his Redeemer would come. Jesus came many years later. In the New Testament He answered Job's questions. Jesus' answer to Job's question about where to find God is: He who has seen me has seen the Father.

16. The New Testament answer to the question about a middle-man is: Jesus is the only middle-man. Jesus' answer to the question about rising from the dead is: I am the resurrection and the life.

17. The answer to this question is: He who has seen me has seen the Father. Job took his suffering patiently. He had some times of darkness and asking questions. But soon his faith returned. We do not know of another man except Jesus who suffered as Job did. And no other person except Jesus was so patient as Job.

From the book of Job we see that only God can give us answers to our questions. Job's friends did not help him. Our Christian friends can give us good advice. But sometimes people make mistakes. The word of God is always right. It is better to see what Jesus says. Then we should preach it to others. You can use some of these questions and verses to make good sermons.

18. The New Testament fulfills or explains the Old Testament. Many truths were hidden in the Old Testament. Now they are clear in the New Testament.

2. The answer to the question about a middle-man is: Jesus is the only middle-man. Jesus' answer to the question about rising from the dead is: I am the resurrection and the life. His answer to the question about where to find God is: He who has seen me has seen the Father.

Today we shall see more ways in which the New Testament helps the Old Testament. We shall see how Jesus added to the truths which Job found.

- (1) Job saw the need to repent of his questions. Jesus said: Repent for the kingdom of heaven is near.
- (2) Job said he would come out of trial as gold. James said the tried man will receive the crown of life.

The New Testament does not destroy the Old Testament. What does the New Testament do?

3. The New Testament fulfills or explains the Old Testament. Job learned much through his suffering. We have seen that he became sure that his Redeemer lives and that he will see God. All this caused Job to do something.

Job 42:5-6:

I had heard of thee by the hearing of the ear, but now my eye sees thee; therefore I despise myself, and repent in dust and ashes.

Matthew 4:17:

(Jesus said) "Repent, for the kingdom of heaven is at hand (or is near)."

What did Job do in dust and ashes when he understood more about God?

\_\_\_\_\_

4. He did not think he was a great person. He did not think he was of great worth. When God talked to Job he saw God's greatness. Job bowed low before God. He could not argue with God. But God loved Job. He loves all men. He sees their suffering and sin. He sent his only Son to die for their sin and save them.

Who thinks Job and all men are of great worth? \_\_\_\_\_

5. **God thinks this.** When we try to live without God, we are nothing. It is when we live by God's plan for us that we have great worth. When we fear God, we refuse to do evil.

God needs Christians today who will humble themselves in times of trouble. We must trust God even when we do not understand what is happening. God always sees us and understands. He give us victory.

Who did God give to die for men? \_\_\_\_\_

---

6. **He gave his only Son to die for men.** This Son is Jesus. He saves us from our sins. He makes us able to live for God. He gives us great worth. Job did not fully understand this, but he saw the greatness of God. He saw his need of a Redeemer.

How did Job feel about his own worth when he was suffering and God spoke to him? \_\_\_\_\_

7. **He saw he was of little worth.** He felt very small.

What did Jesus say about man's worth before God? \_\_\_\_\_

8. **He said that God sent his son to die for men.** Job learned much through his suffering. We have seen that he became sure that his Redeemer lives and that he will see God. All this caused Job to do something.

Job 42:5-6:

I had heard of thee by the hearing of the ear, but now my eye sees thee: therefore I despise myself, and repent in dust and ashes.

Matthew 4:17:

(Jesus said) "Repent, for the kingdom of heaven is at hand (or is near)."

9. **Job repented.** He repented of asking God questions. Job began to see God. This means that he began to understand more clearly about God. When a person begins to learn about God, he hears with his ears. He learns slowly. But he does not repent until he sees God with his spiritual eyes. He must receive Jesus into his heart.

When Jesus began to preach, he said that people should do what? \_\_\_\_\_

10. Jesus said that people should repent. When Job saw God, he repented in dust and ashes. These were signs of Job's sorrow. Job saw that only God was strong and wise. In these days we have more learning than Job had. But we are not always strong and wise as we should be. Many people do not see the need to show sorrow from their sins.

Matthew 4:17:

"Repent, for the kingdom of heaven is at hand (or is near)."

Job saw the need to repent of asking God questions. Why did Jesus say people should repent?

---

---

11. They should do this because the kingdom of heaven is near. Job repented of his questions when he saw the greatness of God. This was long before Jesus came. Jesus came to bring God's rule on earth. He came to bring a new kingdom. When that kingdom is near it is time to prepare for it.

Job saw the need to repent. What did Jesus say about repenting? \_\_\_\_\_

---

12. He said: Repent for the kingdom of heaven is near. We must repent if we want to enter His kingdom. There is no other way. The Old Testament prepared the way for the New Testament. Then the New Testament fulfilled the Old Testament. Job gives us much wisdom. Job learned that suffering was good for him. He knew it would make him better.

Job 23:20:

But he knows the way that I take; when he has tried me, I shall come forth as gold.

James 1:12:

Blessed is the man who endures trial, for when he has stood the test he will receive the crown of life which God has promised to those who love him.

Job said that after he was tried by God, he would come out as what? \_\_\_\_\_

13. Job said that he would come out as gold. God was precious to the people of Job's time. It is still of great worth today. Job understood that he would be better after his time of testing. See again what he said.

Job 23:10:

But he knows the way that I take; when he has tried me, I shall come forth as gold.

In these words, Job said two big things. The first is that God knows everything that is happening to us.

When you remember that God knows every small thing of your life, do you feel happy, or do you feel afraid? \_\_\_\_\_

---

14. If you are fully obeying God, you feel happy. If you are not obeying God, you feel afraid. When we obey God in our temptations they make us strong. When we keep on trusting God in suffering we come out as better people. Job finally understood that he was being tried. He saw that when his tests were finished, God would be pleased. God would say that he was as pure as gold. Look again at the New Testament words about this.

James 1:12:

Blessed is the man who endures trial, for when he has stood the test he will receive the crown of life which God has promised to those who love Him.

What did James say the tried man will receive? \_\_\_\_\_

15. James said that the tried man will receive the crown of life. This is God's promise to those who keep strong faith in Him. If gold is put into a very hot fire, it is not destroyed. The other things are burned up and the gold is made pure.

If a Christian is full of the Holy Spirit, he will not be destroyed by temptation. Instead, his love for God will grow through his suffering.

Job said he was of little worth. What did Jesus say about man's worth?

Job saw the need to repent. What did Jesus say about repenting? \_\_\_\_\_

16. Jesus said that God sent his Son to die for men. Jesus also said: Repent, for the kingdom of heaven is near.

Job said he would come out of trial as gold. What did James say the tried man will receive?

17. Jesus said the tried men will receive the crown of life. God promises eternal life to those who follow Him. This means we must be faithful in suffering. Many people have suffered since Job's time. Paul was beaten, put into prison, and finally killed. History tells us that Peter was crucified upside-down.

Perhaps you will never suffer as Job did. You may not be killed as Paul and Peter were. But if you are a true Christian, you will sometimes suffer. The Bible can show you how to live. The Holy Spirit will give you joy and victory even in difficult tests.

Take time now to pray about your times of testing. Ask God to help you be like Job.
