

WEEK 8: MORE OF PROVERBS
DAY 1: GOOD THINGS WE SHOULD DO

1. We are now ready for another week on the book of Proverbs. Remember what we learned last week.

The wisdom of Proverbs is fulfilled in Christ. In Proverbs 8 wisdom speaks as a person. He who finds wisdom and Christ finds what? _____

2. He who finds wisdom finds life. The book of Proverbs teaches us about part of life. It is God's word. Since we have God's word, we cannot excuse ourselves. We must stop doing those things which are wrong and foolish. We must do those things which are right and wise. Today we learn from Proverbs good things to do. At the end of the lesson you will write four of them. We should:

Take your Bible now and read Proverbs 10:1 to 9. Read verse 2 again. In this verse, what saves us from death? _____

3. Righteousness saves us from death. In chapter 9, the book of Proverbs finished teaching about wisdom as a person. In chapter 10 it begins many proverbs about right living. It is not enough to know the right things. We must do them. One thing Proverbs teaches much about is: Speaking the truth.

Proverbs 10:9, 11:

He who walks in integrity (or truth) walks securely, but he who perverts his ways (or speaks lies) will be found out ... The mouth of the righteous is a fountain of life.

Can a man be righteous and still speak lies? _____

4. He cannot do this. Some people think a few lies do not matter. But sin is ugly. It separates us from God. Lies belong to Satan.

Proverbs 10:19-20:

When words are many, transgression is not lacking, but he who restrains his lips is prudent (or wise). The tongue of the righteous is choice silver.

Solomon is telling us good things to do. What should we speak? _____

5. We should speak the truth. We should also be straight in business. When we sell things we should not try to cheat people.

Proverbs 11:1:

A false balance (or scale) is an abomination to the Lord (or he hates it), but a just (or true) weight is his delight.

Were these words written for the person who sells only ten bags of grain, or for the person who sells a thousand bags of grain, or for both persons?

6. If you said "both persons" you are right. If you said something else, you must read the verse again. God wants straight business if we are selling one small thing. He also wants straight business if we are selling many things. If we cheat in order to make more money, God sees our sin. He is not happy with us. He is happy with the righteous person.

7. Proverbs tells us to speak the truth and be straight in business. It also tells us to share what we have. Here is a surprising proverb. God gives more to those who give.

Proverbs 11:24:

One man gives freely, yet grows all the richer; another withholds (or keeps) what he should give, and only suffers want.

8. God's teachings are for all people. God says we should return one tenth to Him. If we do not do this, we rob God. Then we suffer, and God cannot bless us as He wants to.

Proverbs 11:25:

A liberal man (or one who gives much) will be enriched, and one who waters will himself be watered.

Besides speaking the truth and being straight in business, what else should we do?

9. We should **share what we have**. We should also be willing to take good advice. This is not always easy to do. We would rather take our own way. Instead we should listen to those who try to teach us.

Proverbs 10:17:

He who heeds (or listens to) instruction is on the path to life, but he who rejects reproof (or refuses to listen) goes astray.

Is the person who listens to good advice a wise man or a foolish man? _____

10. He is a wise man. Pride in our hearts shuts God out. But His teachings are for all people. His teachings give us light. Therefore people who take their own way have no way of escape. Some people say that they were made with proud hearts and they cannot change. But God can change our hearts.

Proverbs 12:15:

The way of the fool is right in his own eyes, but a wise man listens to advice.

In this verse, what good thing is Proverbs telling us to do?

11. We should listen to good advice. Of course we should not listen to everyone, but to God's people. Proverbs also tells us to help our nation be righteous. Some people say we should not worry about the government. But look what Proverbs says.

Proverbs 14:34:

Righteousness exalts (or lifts up) a nation, but sin is a reproach (or brings shame) to any people.

If we pray about elections do you think we help our nation be righteous? _____

12. The Bible tells us to pray for our leaders. We can also pray for the right ones to be chosen. God lifts up the nation that honours Him. Government leaders should follow truth and be just with the laws. If they fail to do so, they bring dishonour to the whole nation.

What is Proverbs telling us to do? _____

13. We should help our nation be righteous. To do this we should also hate bribes. A bribe is money given to get someone to do something wrong. A nation becomes very weak when its people accept bribes. The child of God hates all sinful ways of making money. He would rather be honest and remain poor than to give or receive bribes.

Proverbs 17:23:

A wicked person accepts a bribe from the bosom (or secretly) to pervert (or spoil) the ways of justice.

Proverbs 15:27:

He who is greedy for unjust gain makes trouble for his household, but he who hates bribes will live.

Read these verses again. What will happen to the person who hates bribes?

14. The one who hates bribes will live. The one who accepts bribes is sinful. A bribe is a secret thing. One person gives it secretly. Another person accepts it secretly. But God sees it. This is unfair to others, and God says it is sinful.

15. We should: Listen to good advice. Help our nation be righteous. Hate bribes. And we should teach our children well. Parents have a great work. If they do not teach their children well, there will be much sorrow.

Proverbs 20:7:

A righteous man who walks in his integrity (or truth) -- blessed are his sons after him!

Proverbs 13:24:

He who spares the rod hates his son, but he who loves him is diligent to discipline him.

If a parent refuses to punish his child, what does Proverbs say he does to his son?

16. He hates him. He does not love him enough to punish him. There must be good teaching for children. We must begin while they are very young. They must be taught to obey their parents. Then it will not be so difficult for them to obey God. Remember that much of our teaching is by our example. Children must see God in us or they will not believe our teaching.

Proverbs 22:6:

Train up a child in the way he should go, and when he is old he will not depart from it.

What is the last good thing in this part of Proverbs which we must do?

17. We must teach our children well. We should not only stay away from sinful things. We should also do these good things. Some people may say that these teachings are in the Old Testament. We do not need them now. But see what Paul said.

I Corinthians 6:9-10:

Do you not know that the unrighteous will not inherit the kingdom of God? Do not be deceived ... nor thieves, nor the greedy, nor drunkards, nor revilers, nor robbers will inherit the kingdom of God.

Say to yourself the good things in this lesson which Proverbs tells us to do.

18. If you could say four that is good. If you could say all seven, that is very good. We should: Speak the truth, be straight in business, share what we have, listen to good advice, help our nation be righteous, hate bribery, and teach our children well. Here is another promise from Proverbs for the man who does right.

Proverbs 12:2-3:

A good man obtains favor from the Lord, but a man of evil devices he condemns. A man is not established by wickedness, but the root of the righteous will never be moved.

Perhaps you know a Christian who is trying to do right but is discouraged. He wonders whether God is pleased with what he is doing. Go to this friend and tell him what you have learned in this lesson. Thank him for doing right. Be ready to tell the class what he said.

WEEK 8: MORE OF PROVERBS

DAY 2: THE FEAR OF THE LORD BRINGS A HAPPY LIFE

1. Yesterday we saw many proverbs which show us right and wrong. Write four good things the book of Proverbs tells us to do.

2. Proverbs tells us to: Speak the truth, be straight in business, share what we have, listen to good advice, help our nation be righteous, hate bribery, and teach our children well. Each of us wants a good life. God's word is perfect. It shows us everything we need. But one teaching may surprise us at first. Today we learn:

The fear of the Lord is
a fountain of life.

Take your Bible now and read Proverbs 14:20 to 27. Do you like to be afraid of things? _____

3. We do not like to feel afraid. Fear does not seem to be a good thing. Arap Rob was not a Christian. He was filled with many fears. He was afraid that his cows would become ill. He was afraid his children might die. He thought his garden would not grow because of insects or not enough rain. Because of all these fears, he was very unhappy. But Arap Rob's neighbour, Musa, was a Christian. He invited Arap Rob to go to church with him. Whom would Arap Rob learn about in church? _____

4. He would learn about God. It was good for Musa to take him to church. He had been praying for Arap Rob. He was happy when he agreed to go. That Sunday the pastor preached on this verse.

Proverbs 14:27:

The fear of the Lord is a fountain of life.

On the way home, Arap Rob said, "I will not go to church again. My life is already full of fears. Now the pastor says that I must fear God. He has added to my fears."

Do you think Arap Rob understood what the pastor really said? _____

5. We are sure he did not understand. Then Musa explained many things to him. He said that when we fear God, we respect Him. We love and trust Him. He showed him these verses which we read.

Proverbs 14:26-27:

In the fear of the Lord one has strong confidence (or trust) and his children will have a refuge (or place of protection). The fear of the Lord is a fountain of life.

Trust and a fountain of life are found in the fear of whom? _____

6. We find these in the fear of the Lord. The fear of the Lord takes away other fears. We must understand the fear of the Lord. Then we have a happy life. One preacher explained it this way, "Fear God and have no other fears."

Proverbs 2:3-5:

If you cry out ... for understanding, if you seek ... then you will understand the fear of the Lord.

2 Timothy 2:7:

Think over what I say, for the Lord will grant you understanding in everything.

The fear of the Lord is a fountain of what? _____

7. The fear of the Lord is a fountain of life. This means that life keeps coming from it. A fountain is a place where water always comes forth. From the fear of the Lord, life will always keep coming to us. We have already seen this verse in the beginning of Proverbs.

Proverbs 1:7:

The fear of the Lord is the beginning of knowledge.

We learned that knowledge leads to wisdom and wisdom leads to life. What is the beginning of knowledge? _____

8. The beginning of knowledge is the fear of the Lord. So the fear of the Lord is two things. It is the beginning of knowledge and it is the fountain of life. The whole book of Proverbs teaches us that fear of the Lord is needed for a good life. When we fear God, we hate evil. Because we hate evil, we live a pure life.

Proverbs 8:13:

The fear of the Lord is hatred of evil.

Proverbs 21:8:

... the conduct (or way of living) for the pure is right.

Think carefully of our verse for today. It says that the fear of the Lord is a what of life? _____

9. The fear of the Lord is a fountain of life. The person who fears God has a happy life.

Proverbs 15:16:

Better is a little with the fear of the Lord than great treasure and trouble with it.

Proverbs 19:23:

The fear of the Lord leads to life; and he who has it rests satisfied; he will not be visited by harm.

Do people who truly fear God honour Him every day, or only on Sunday? _____

10. The people who truly fear God honour Him every day. They believe that fearing God is better than great riches. God gives them peace. Remember that the fear of the Lord is a fountain of life.

Which is better: Cattle or peace with God? _____

Money or peace with God? _____

A high position or peace with God? _____

11. We shall talk about this in class. The person who has no peace cannot truly enjoy his cattle or money or high position.

From Proverbs 14:27, the fear of the Lord is what? _____

Musa showed Arap Rob all these truths from Proverbs. Arap Rob had never heard such great teaching. Musa had one more verse to show his friend.

Proverbs 16:20:

Happy is he who trusts in the Lord.

There is a kind of happiness which comes with sin. But it stays only a very short time. Then it is followed by sorrow.

Where is the verse found which says that the fear of the Lord is a fountain of life?

13. It is found in Proverbs 14:27. The person who follows the way of sin is foolish. The joy of those who fear God remains forever. Even when troubles come, those who fear God can trust Him. They can continue to be happy. God helps them in all their troubles. He gives them joy. It is like dipping water from a fountain which is always flowing.

From Proverbs 14:27, the fear of the Lord is what? _____

14. The fear of the Lord is a fountain of life. When Musa had finished explaining these proverbs, Arap Rob said, "I like these words very much. They speak a new message to my heart. May I go to church with you again next Sunday?"

WEEK 8: MORE OF PROVERBS

DAY 3: BY GOD'S JUDGMENT WE ARE SAVED OR LOST

1. Yesterday we learned to fear the Lord does not mean that we run away from Him. Instead we respect, love and obey Him.

We learn a great lesson from Proverbs 14:27. The fear of the Lord is what?

2. The fear of the Lord is a fountain of life. The book of Proverbs tells about many things. There are so many things that we cannot touch many of them. In chapters 26 to 29 there are 110 proverbs about different subjects. But one big truth comes out. We know that people are either saved or they are lost. This is what we shall learn today.

It is by God's judgment
and not man's that we are
saved or lost.

Take your Bible now and read Proverbs 27:1 to 8.

Remember that this is God's word. Have almost all the people of your village heard some of the word of God?

3. In some countries almost all the people have heard God's word. In other countries only a few have heard. Even where people have heard, many are not Christians. They do not stop to think about God's judgment. They do not think about His word. They are following the way of sin. They forget that it is by God's judgment and not man's that we are saved or lost.

Is it enough for us to know what God says, or must we do what God says?

4. We must do what God says. We may have our own thoughts about good and evil. Some people think they are saved because they are not so bad as other people. Some think they will be saved because they keep the laws of their people. But it is by God's judgment and not ours that we are saved or lost.

Are we saved by knowing all the proverbs of our people and living by them?

5. **This is not enough to save us from eternal death. We must know what God says. We must believe His plan of salvation through Christ. We must live God's way as Christ gives us power.**

Sometimes people fear the words of men more than the word of God. Proverbs shows us that if a person is cursed without a cause, the curse will do him no harm. It is like a bird flying over his head without stopping. Goliath cursed David but it did not hurt him. David was saved by the power of God.

Proverbs 26:2:

Like a sparrow in its flitting, like a swallow in its flying, a curse that is causeless does not alight.

Who is God's great enemy who wants all people to be cursed and lost? _____

6. **Satan is God's enemy. God wants to teach us the true way. Then we must let God change us. He wants us to follow His way, not our own. Satan wants us to follow our own way.**

Proverbs 26:13:

Do you see a man who is wise in his own eyes? There is more hope for a fool than for him.

By whose judgment are we saved or lost? Is it by God's judgment or man's judgment? _____

7. **It is by God's judgment and not man's that we are saved or lost. The New Testament tells us to love our neighbour as ourselves. Many years before, Solomon wrote about how we treat our neighbour.**

Proverbs 26:18-19:

Like a madman who throws firebrands, arrows, and death, is the man who deceives his neighbor and says, "I am only joking (or playing)!"

Such a person is not clever. God says that he is sinful.

Do men's judgments bring life and save us? _____

8. **Men's judgments cannot bring life. They cannot save us. Man's wisdom cannot make a way of salvation. Many people say they are good, even when they know they are sinful. Satan likes to blind people to the truth. It is by God's judgment and not man's that we are saved or lost. Here is another proverb.**

Proverbs 27:2:

Let another praise you, and not your own mouth.

Perhaps I have done something very good but no one praises me. This should not trouble me. It was God who made me able to do the good thing. He should get the praise.

If I depend on my own judgment, am I saved or lost? _____

9. I am lost. I cannot save myself by my own thinking and planning. I cannot depend on my own judgment. I must know what God says. I must respect Him and love Him. I must obey Him. I must not praise myself. The glory belongs to God and not to me. Jesus did not praise Himself. He praised His heavenly Father.

It is by God's judgment and not man's that we are what?

10. It is by God's judgment that we are saved or lost. It is easy for men to think they are strong and know much. But Proverbs has a warning about this.

Proverbs 27:1:

Do not boast about tomorrow, for you do not know what a day may bring forth.

Can we be sure what will happen tomorrow? _____

11. Man does not even know what will happen tomorrow. So he is not able to save himself by his own judgment. Instead he must take God's way and serve him. One way to serve Him is by caring for other Christians.

Proverbs 27:23-24:

Know well the condition of your flocks, and give attention to your herds; for riches do not last for ever; and does a crown endure to all generations?

These words tell a man to care for his possessions. How can these verses help a pastor care for his church people? _____

12. We shall talk about this together. The sheep and cattle are like the people of the church. If a pastor wants to work well, he must know his people. He must feed them the Bread of Life and give them Living Water.

Who judges the work of a pastor? _____

13. God is the great Judge. Proverbs also tells us that the sheep give food and clothes for the shepherd.

Proverbs 27:25-26:

When the grass is gone, and the new growth appears, and the herbage of the mountains is gathered, the lambs will provide your clothing, and the goats the price of a field.

The people of the church should sometimes help a faithful pastor with food and money. Then he can give much time to preaching and teaching the word of God. He can visit those who are ill and comfort those in sorrow. He can do the full work of a pastor. He can help many to believe and be saved.

He who keeps the law is a wise son, but a companion (or friend) of gluttons (or those who eat too much) shames his father.

DAY 4: GOD IS A SHIELD

1. This is our last day to study the book of Proverbs. It comes after the books of Job and Psalms in the books of songs. David wrote most of the Psalms.

God is a shield to those who put their trust in Him.

Praise for the good woman comes from:

3. Agur said that every word of God is true. He also said something else about God.

Every word of God proves true; He is a shield to those who take refuge in Him.

4. God is a shield. But why do we need a shield? Satan is trying to defeat us. Agur says there are things too difficult for us to understand.

Proverbs 30:19:

the way of an eagle in the sky, the way of a serpent on a rock, the way of a ship on the high seas, and the way of a man with a maiden.

When the bird, the snake, and the ship have gone, they leave no path behind them. And people who commit adultery say they have done nothing wrong. They say they have left no mark behind them.

But find Exodus 20:14 in your Bible. What does God say in this verse? _____

5. **God says we should not commit adultery. And every word of God is true. The power of God working in us can keep us from the sin of adultery.**

What is God to those who trust in Him? _____

6. **God is a shield to those who trust in Him. Now let us look at chapter 31.**

Proverbs 31:1:

The words of Lemuel, king of Massa, which his mother taught him.

Some people think that Lemuel is another name for Solomon. Lemuel (or Solomon) wrote what his mother had taught him when he was young. We do not let the question about the writer trouble us. God is the one who gave the teachings. We receive the teachings and they help us.

Take your Bible now and read Proverbs 31:10 to 15. Who is praised in these verses?

7. **A good woman or wife is praised. Praise for her comes from:**

When children are young, they are with their mother most of the time. But the mother is not the only one who should teach them what is good.

Proverbs 4:1:

Hear, O sons, a father's instruction.

8. **The father should also teach the children the right way. He should teach them to obey God. He should teach them to love their mother. He does this by his example.**

Proverbs 31:11-12:

The heart of her husband trusts in her, and he will have no lack of gain. She does him good, and not harm, all the days of her life.

Will this kind of husband praise his wife or beat her to make her obey?

9. **He will praise his wife. He will work with her to bring up the children in the right way. The mother of Lemuel calls him the son of her vows. This means that she prayed to God to give her a son. Then she promised to give him back to God.**

Is this a good thing for parents to do today? _____

10. Talk about this in class if you like. Children are a gift from God. Parents should try to teach them the ways of God. This mother warned her son against strong drink and adultery. She told him to use his riches wisely and be fair to poor people. She reminded him to choose a wife carefully.

When a woman does her work so well, what will her husband say about her?

11. He will praise her.

Proverbs 31:27:

She looks well to the ways of her household, and does not eat the bread of idleness. Her children rise up and call her blessed; her husband also, and he praises her.

Proverbs 31:15:

Proverbs 31:16, 19:

Is a good woman busy or lazy? _____

15. A good woman is busy. She does not have time to be lazy. Everyone can see her good works.

Proverbs 31:20:

She opens her hand to the poor, and reaches out her hands to the needy.

In Proverbs 31, to whom do good works bring praise, besides to God? _____

16. They bring praise to a good woman.

Proverbs 31:23-25:

He husband is known in the gates, when he sits among the elders of the land. She makes linen garments and sells them; she deliver girdles (or belts) to the merchant. Strength and dignity are her clothing, and she laughs at the time to come.
