

## WEEK 10: JUDE

### DAY 1: WE MUST FIGHT FOR THE FAITH

Jude 1-4

1. Today we begin the last of the seven letters for all churches. The last letter is Jude. Like the other writers, Jude wrote some things about false teachers and unfaithful people.

From 3 John, what two things do unfaithful people do?

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2. John said that unfaithful people put themselves first. They speak evil of leaders. Jude wrote many more things about unfaithful people. But who is this Jude who wrote the letter? He says that he is the brother of James. The James who was well known was the leader of the church in Jerusalem. This James was the brother of Jesus. If Jude was the brother of James in Jerusalem, then Jude was also the brother of Jesus. He had the same mother but not the same father.

Mark 6:3:

Is not this the carpenter, the son of Mary and brother of James and Joses and Judas (or Jude) and Simon, and are not his sisters here with us?

Now take your Bible and read the beginning of Jude's letter. Read Jude 1 to 4.

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3. Many people agree that the writer of this letter is Jude, the brother of Jesus. We have seen that after Jesus rose from the dead, his brothers believed on him.

Acts 1:14:

All these with one accord devoted themselves to prayer, together with the women and Mary the mother of Jesus, and with his brothers.

Jude wrote about the faith. Did he have the faith himself? \_\_\_\_\_

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4. Jude had the faith. He believed on Jesus after he rose from the dead. He followed the way of Jesus. It seems that he also became a leader in the church. Jude's letter shows great concern for the Christians. In it, Jude warned the believers not to fall away.

Today we will see why Jude wrote his letter. He wrote it so that believers would fight for the faith.

**Jude 3:**

Beloved (or loved ones), being very eager to write to you of our common salvation, I found it necessary to write appealing to you to contend (or fight) for the faith which was once for all delivered to the saints.

What did Jude call the people when he told them to fight for the faith?

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5. He called them "beloved" or "loved ones". They were his brothers in Christ. They were the believers. But Jude was afraid that they would lose what they had. So he told them to fight for it.

He did not mean that they should fight with spears or guns. He did not mean that they should argue. He meant that they should stand and be strong. They should not give way to false teachers and unfaithful people. They should not give in to sin.

What did Jude say they should fight for? \_\_\_\_\_

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6. They should do this for the faith. When Jude talked about the faith he did not only mean believing in Jesus for salvation. He was talking about all that we believe. He meant all that the Bible teaches. False teachers will try to take all this away. They will try to destroy the faith.

What did Jude say we must do for the faith? \_\_\_\_\_

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7. We must fight for it. Many people want to destroy the faith. There were people like this in the Bible. And there are people like this today. They do not want to follow Jesus. They do not want to see other people following him. So they try to change what people believe. They say the truth is not just as Jesus and the Bible gave it. They try to destroy the faith.

Who wrote that we must fight for the faith? \_\_\_\_\_

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8. Jude wrote that we should fight for the faith. This was his reason for writing his letter. He says that he wanted to write about salvation, but instead he had to write about the faith. Let us look at his words again.

**Jude 3:**

Beloved, being very eager to write to you of our common salvation, I found it necessary to write appealing to you to contend for the faith which was once for all delivered to the saints.

What do you think could happen to the church if believers did not fight for the faith?

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9. You could answer in different ways. You could say that the church would lose the faith. Or the church would fall away from the faith. You could say that the church would not longer be following Jesus.

What did Jude say we must fight for? \_\_\_\_\_

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10. We must fight for the faith. Moyo was asked to speak in a youth meeting. Before Moyo spoke, another man made a speech. He told the young people that Jesus did not rise from the dead. He said that the followers of Jesus stole his body from the grave.

As a Christian, what should Moyo do to fight for the faith? \_\_\_\_\_

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11. He should tell the truth. He should say that Jesus did rise from the dead. He should protect the truth.

This is what Moyo did. He stood and said, "Jesus did rise from the dead. After he came from the grave, he spoke to people. He ate with people. Some of the people saw Jesus go to heaven." Moyo gave the young people verses from the Bible to show that Jesus rose from the dead.

If we do not fight for the faith, will our children have the true faith? \_\_\_\_\_

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12. They will not have it. They will believe lies instead. We must fight for the faith. We must stand for the truth. This will help others to stand for it.

We must fight for the faith so that our children can receive it. There were enemies of the faith during the time of Jude. These enemies were in the church, but they taught things which destroyed the church. They were false teachers. Jude wrote to warn the Christians about them.

Do you think we need this warning today? \_\_\_\_\_

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13. There are false teachers in the church today. So we need this warning from Jude. There are people today who call themselves Christians. But they act against the teaching of the Christian faith. This is the kind of people Jude wrote about.

**Jude 4:**

For admission has been secretly gained by some (or some have secretly entered) who long ago were designated (or pointed out) for this condemnation (or punishment), ungodly persons who pervert (or turn) the grace of our God into licentiousness (or free sin) and deny our only Master and Lord, Jesus Christ.

What does Jude say we must do for the faith? \_\_\_\_\_

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14. He says we must fight for it. There are many people today who call themselves Christians. But they do things which are against the teaching of the Bible. They say they are free to sin because these are days of grace. Some say that it does not matter what you believe if you try to be good. Some say that Jesus is not the only way to heaven. They say there are many other ways.

What do you think we should do to overcome the work of these people?

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15. We will talk about this question in class. One answer is that we should be very careful to preach the truth.

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**WEEK 10: JUDE**

**DAY 2: JUDE WARNED ABOUT UNBELIEF, PRIDE AND FOLLOWING EVIL DESIRE**

**Jude 5-7**

1. Jude had a very good reason for writing his letter. He began his letter with a warning.

What did he say we Christians should do for our faith? \_\_\_\_\_  
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2. Jude said we should fight for our faith. Then he went on to give warnings about sin. He gave three examples from the Old Testament of people who became careless. They fell into sin and they were punished.

From these three examples, we see three sins which we must be careful not to fall into. These are what we will learn today.



We must be careful not to fall into:

- (1) Unbelief
- (2) Pride
- (3) Following evil desires

Take your Bible now and read Jude 5 to 7.

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3. First Jude wrote about the people of Israel. God brought them out of Egypt. But after he brought them out, many people stopped believing in him. This is sin. Jude wants us to be careful about the sin of unbelief.

**Jude 5:**

Now I desire to remind you, though you were once for all fully informed, that he who saved a people out of the land of Egypt, afterward destroyed those who did not believe.

What did God do to those who fell into the sin of unbelief? \_\_\_\_\_  
\_\_\_\_\_

4. He destroyed them. This is what he did to the people of Israel. There are people in the church today who do not want to believe God. They do not want to accept what God says. If we do not believe, we can never be with God in heaven. This sin will cut us off from God.

Hebrews 11:6:

And without faith it is impossible to please him. For whoever would draw near to God must believe that he exists and that he rewards those who seek him.

Is it a small thing or a big thing if we do not believe God? \_\_\_\_\_

5. It is a big thing. This sin will keep us from God. God has made us so that we can believe. But we must choose to believe. Some people choose not to believe. Their own choice will cut them off from God.

What is the first sin which Jude warns us about? \_\_\_\_\_

6. He warns us about the sin of unbelief. Manasseh was a strong Christian boy. He helped to teach in the Sunday School. He believed God with all his heart. Then he went to secondary school. He made friends with boys who were not Christians. They laughed about his faith in God. Manasseh began to laugh too. He laughed at the Bible. He fell into the sin of unbelief. Soon he forgot to follow God.

In what book of the Bible are we warned about the sin of unbelief? \_\_\_\_\_

7. We are warned in the book of Jude. Jude warned us about three sins. Write the first sin he warned us about.

- (1) \_\_\_\_\_  
(2) Pride  
(3) Following evil desire

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8. The first sin is unbelief, The second is pride. Jude tells us about angels who became very proud. They wanted to be higher than God. They began to cause trouble in heaven. When they did not obey God any more, God put them out of heaven.

Jude 6:

And the angels that did not keep their own position but left their proper dwelling have been kept by him in eternal chains in the nether gloom (or darkness) until the judgment of the great day.

What sin makes us want a higher position than we should have? \_\_\_\_\_

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9. This is the sin of pride. The angels had pride and God put them away from him.

Isaiah 14:13-15:

You said in your heart, 'I will ascend to heaven; above the stars of God I will set my throne on high; . . . I will make myself like the Most High.' But you are brought down to Sheol (or hell), to the depths of the Pit.

1 Peter 5:5:

Clothe yourselves, all of you, with humility toward one another, for "God opposes the proud, but gives grace to the humble."

What should we have instead of pride? \_\_\_\_\_

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10. We should have humility. We should be humble before each other. And we should be humble before God.

Listu felt very clever because he was going to Bible college. When he finished he felt that he knew more than the leaders of the church. He did not obey the church elders any more. He said that he had dreams from God. He started his own church. He taught people strange things. He did not teach them how to be saved and follow God. He caused much trouble among the people.

What sin did Listu have which Jude warned about? \_\_\_\_\_

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11. Listu had pride. His pride kept him from following God, and he will be judged for this. Perhaps we are not tempted to start another church. But Satan often tempts us to be proud. We think we know more than other people. Or we think we look better than other people. Sometimes we are even tempted to be proud of the fact that we are Christians. We look down on other people. But this is sin. And we will be judged like the angels who had pride.

Who warned us not to fall into the sin of pride? \_\_\_\_\_

12. Jude warned us about this. He wrote his letter to help Christians not to fall away from the faith. We have learned two of the sins which he warned about.

What are they? (1) \_\_\_\_\_

(3) Following evil desire.

13. Jude warned us about unbelief and pride. He also reminded us of the evil desire which people of Sodom and Gomorrah followed. These people desired to do evil things with their bodies. They did just what their bodies wanted. Their desire ruled them. They did many shameful things with their bodies. And God destroyed them.

Jude 7:

Just as Sodom and Gomorrah and the surrounding cities, which likewise acted immorally and indulged in unnatural lust (or followed their evil desires), serve as an example by undergoing a punishment of eternal fire.

Evil desire ruled the people of Sodom and Gomorrah. What will we fall into when evil desire rules us?  
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14. We will fall into sin. Sometimes people like those of Sodom and Gomorrah come to our churches today. They come as friendly people, but they really want to lead people into sin. Jude says that we must refuse to listen to such people.

What sin of Sodom and Gomorrah did Jude warn us about? \_\_\_\_\_

15. The third sin which Jude warned about was following evil desire.

Mesuri said that he was an evangelist. He visited many churches. He held his meetings at night. He told the men and women it was all right to follow the desires of their bodies. He deceived them with smooth words and then led them into sin. This brought great shame to the church.

What sin did Mesuri lead the people into? \_\_\_\_\_

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16. He led them into the sin of following evil desire. He said that his body made him do it. He said it was not his fault. The Bible tells us that it is our fault. God does not make us fall into sin. We are tempted by our own desire. And we choose to obey our bodies or not to obey them. We learned about this in the letter of James.

James 1:14:

But each person is tempted when he is lured and enticed by his own desire.

Can we excuse ourselves if we follow the evil desires of our bodies? \_\_\_\_\_

What are the first two sins Jude warns us about?

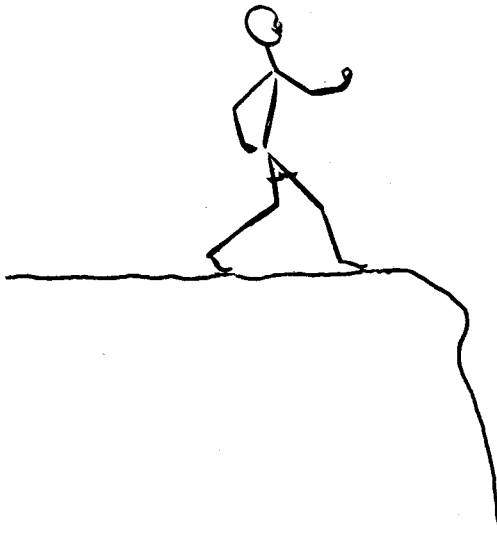

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17. Jude warns us about unbelief and pride.

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18. Jude also warns us about following evil desire. These are sins which can come into the church. They can make us lose our faith. We must fight against them.

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**WEEK 10: JUDE**

**DAY 3: FALSE TEACHERS WILL BE JUDGED**

Jude 8-19

1. Jude wrote his letter as a letter of warning.

What three sins did Jude say we must not fall into?

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2. Jude warned us about the sins of unbelief, pride, and following evil desire. Today we will learn more about false teachers who lead into these sins. When we studied 2 Peter, we saw what false teachers are like. Now Jude gives some very strong words about them. He explains that they are like five things.

- (1) Spots or stones in the feasts
- (2) Clouds without water
- (3) Trees without fruit
- (4) Wild waves of the sea
- (5) Stars wandering in darkness

At the end of the lesson you will be asked to write two of these. You will also write that false teachers will be judged.

Take your Bible now and read Jude 8 to 19.

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3. Jude wrote first that these people are like spots or stones in the feasts. These people were not just outside the church troubling the Christians. They were on the inside. They were like rotten food or dirty food.

Jude 4 and 12:

For admission has been secretly gained by some who long ago were designated for this condemnation.

These are blemishes (or spots or stones) on your love feasts, as they boldly carouse (or play) together, looking after themselves.

Who were spots or stones in the meetings of the Christians?

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4. These were false teachers. They pretended to be Christians. They came to the fellowship meetings. They even took communion. But they only came to look after themselves. They came to have a good time. They came to have parties in the church. When the church had love feasts or fellowship meetings, they made trouble.

What did Jude say the false teachers were like in the feasts?

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5. They were like spots or stones in the feasts. They spoiled the meetings. They spoiled the fellowship. Jude also said that they were like clouds without water.

Jude 12:

... waterless clouds, carried along by winds.

Sometimes we like to see clouds come. They can bring rain. They can bring many blessings through the rain. But sometimes they are only clouds. They do not have any rain in them.

Do clouds make light or darkness? \_\_\_\_\_

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6. They make darkness. They hide the light of the sun. Jude says false teachers are like this. They only bring darkness. John taught us that God is light. But false teachers keep us from seeing the light. They keep us from seeing the truth which God wants us to walk in.

What is the second name which Jude gives to false teachers?

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7. They are clouds without water. They only bring darkness. Jude says they are also trees without fruit. They do not produce any good works for God.

Jude 12:

... fruitless trees in late autumn, twice dead, uprooted.

Why do these trees not produce any fruit? \_\_\_\_\_

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8. They are dead. False teachers do not have any spiritual life. They have not been born again. They are not God's children. They do not act as God's children. They do not bear any fruit for him. They do not show love, joy, peace, and the other fruit of the Spirit.

You remember that Jesus once cursed a tree which did not have any fruit.

Matthew 21:19:

And seeing a fig tree by the wayside he went to it, and found nothing on it but leaves only. And he said to it, "May no fruit ever come from you again!" And the fig tree withered at once.

What is the third name which Jude gives to false teachers?

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9. He said that they are trees without fruit. Then he went on to say that they are like wild waves of the sea. Perhaps you have stood by a dam or lake when the wind is blowing. Or perhaps you have stood by the sea. The water becomes very rough and goes this way and that. Jude says that some people are like this. They are not strong or steady. And they throw up their sins for people to see.

Jude 13:

wild waves of the sea, casting up the foam of their own shame.

Who throws up their own shame for people to see? \_\_\_\_\_

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10. False teachers do this. They do not stay strong and peaceful. They run here and there like water. Everyone can see their sins. They are not ashamed of the bad things they do. Remember that Jude said they even do sins in the church.

What is the fourth name which Jude gives to false teachers?

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11. They are wild waves of the sea. They are not faithful. Everyone can see their shame. Finally Jude says they are wandering stars in darkness. Jude tries very hard to warn us about these false teachers. They try to give light like stars. But they are only deceivers.

Jude 13:

... wandering stars for whom the nether gloom of darkness has been reserved for ever.

Do these people go straight forward? \_\_\_\_\_

Do they live in light? \_\_\_\_\_

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12. They do not go straight. And they are in darkness. They do not follow God. They wander here and there like some stars. Perhaps you have seen a star which went quickly across the sky. Then what happened? It went out. Jude says that false teachers are wandering stars in darkness. He shows us that in the end, false teachers will be judged.

Write two other names which Jude gives to false teachers.

13. Jude says that false teachers are spots or stones in the feasts. They are clouds without water. They are trees without fruit, and wild waves of the sea. He shows us that they will be judged.

Jude 4:

For admission has been secretly gained by some who long ago were designated (or pointed out) for this condemnation (or judgment).

Besides spots in feasts, clouds without water, trees without fruit and wild waves of the sea, what name does Jude give to false teachers?

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14. He calls them wandering stars in darkness. He says that they will be judged as Cain, Balaam, and Korah were judged.

Jude 11:

Woe to them! For they walk in the way of Cain, and abandon themselves (or let themselves go) for the sake of gain to Balaam's error, and perish in Korah's rebellion.

Cain was punished with a curse from God. Balaam was killed in fighting because he taught people to disobey God. Korah was swallowed up by the earth because he led people away from the truth.

Who does Jude say will be judged? \_\_\_\_\_

15. This will happen to false teachers. Jude wanted to warn the people about false teaching. He wanted to warn them about leaving God's way. We may say we are Christians. We may go to church. But unless we follow the truth, we will not see God.

Jude 14:

... "Behold, the Lord came with his holy myriads, to execute judgment on all, and to convict all the ungodly of all their deeds of ungodliness which they have committed in such an ungodly way, and of all the harsh things which ungodly sinners have spoken against him."

What will happen to false teachers? \_\_\_\_\_

16. They will be judged. God will judge them for their sinful ways. He will punish them for deceiving people.

Write two names which Jude gives to false teachers.

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17. Jude called them spots or stones in the feasts. They are clouds without water. They are trees without fruit and wild waves of the sea. They are wandering stars in darkness. If you wrote two of these, you did well.

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18. False teachers will be judged. They will be judged for all the evil things which they have done. It seems Jude cannot finish warning us about them.

Jude 16 and 19:

These are grumblers, malcontents, following their own passions, loud-mouthed boasters, flattering people to gain advantage.

It is these who set up divisions, worldly people, devoid (empty) of the Spirit.

People of the world are like this. But it is terrible when there are people like this in the church.

Stop now and pray for yourself and your people. Ask God's help that none of you may be false teachers.

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**WEEK 10: JUDE**

**DAY 4: JESUS WILL KEEP US FROM FALLING AND PRESENT US TO GOD**

Jude 20-25

1. Yesterday we saw the warning which Jude gave about false teachers.

Write two names which Jude gives to false teachers.

What will happen to false teachers? \_\_\_\_\_

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2. Jude says that false teachers are spots or stones in the feasts. They are clouds without water and trees without fruit. They are wild waves of the sea and wandering stars in darkness. False teachers will be judged. All sinners will be judged, but God has made a way for us to be saved.

Jude ends his letter by telling what Jesus is able to do for us. He says that Jesus is able to do two things for us. This is what we will learn today.

(1) He is able to keep us from falling.

(2) He is able to present us to God.

Take your Bible now and read Jude 20 to 25.

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3. Jude wrote his letter to beg the Christians to fight for the faith. He knew that some of them would be tempted to fall. They would be tempted to listen to false teachers. But Jude ended his letter with another truth. Jude wanted us to know that we can stand true by God's help. We can be kept from falling.

Jude 24-25:

Now to him who is able to keep you from falling and to present you without blemish (or spot) before the presence of his glory with rejoicing, to the only God, our Savior through Jesus Christ our Lord, be glory, majesty, dominion, and authority (or power), before all time and now and for ever. Amen.

Who is able to keep us from falling? \_\_\_\_\_

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4. Jesus is able to do this. Some people say that we are too weak to refuse sin. But we have learned that we can overcome sin. We know that Jesus is our Saviour. He forgives us of our sins, and he gives us power to overcome them. Jesus has all power. He can do this for us.

Whom will Jesus keep from falling? \_\_\_\_\_

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5. He will keep us from falling. He will keep all Christians from falling if they let him. When we studied the letters of Peter, we read this verse.

2 Peter 1:10:

Therefore, brethren, be the more zealous to confirm your call and election (or being chosen by God), for if you do this you will never fall.

What does Jude say Jesus is able to keep us from doing? \_\_\_\_\_

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6. Jesus is able to keep us from falling. But Jude and Peter say there are some things for us to do too. Peter says we must make our being chosen sure. Jude tells us how to do this.

Jude 20-23:

But you, beloved, build yourselves up on your most holy faith; pray in the Holy Spirit; keep yourselves in the love of God; wait for the mercy of our Lord Jesus Christ unto eternal life. And convince some, who doubt; save some, by snatching them out of the fire; on some have mercy with fear, hating even the garment spotted by the flesh.

Who should do these things in order to keep from falling? \_\_\_\_\_

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7. We should do them. All Christians should do them. Some people think there is nothing for us to do. We just believe Jesus and then do whatever we like. But Jude gives us some things to do. Look at them again.

Build yourselves up on your most holy faith.

Pray in the Holy Spirit.

Keep yourselves in the love of God.

Wait for the mercy of our Lord Jesus Christ unto eternal life.

Convince some who doubt.

Save some by snatching them out of the fire.

As we do these things, what is Jesus able to do for us?

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8. Jesus is able to keep us from falling. He will keep us as we do our part. We should keep on believing God's promises and be strong. We should pray, letting the Holy Spirit pray through us. We should keep ourselves in God's love by obeying him, as we have learned. We should keep looking forward to life in heaven which Jesus promised. We should help those who doubt to

believe. We should help to save those who are going into the fire of hell.

9. The second thing Jesus will do for us is to present us to God. When we believe Jesus, he becomes our Saviour. We can also say that we belong to Jesus. The Bible says Jesus bought us with his precious blood. We are his!

1 Peter 1:18-19:

You know that you were ransomed (or bought back) from the futile ways inherited from your fathers, not with perishable things such as silver or gold, but with the precious blood of Christ.

We belong to Jesus. He is able to present us to God. That is the second thing he is able to do. What is the first thing? \_\_\_\_\_

10. He is able to keep us from falling. Remember that Jesus has bought us. We belong to him. And some day he will present us without any spots.

When God created Adam and Eve, they belonged to him. But Adam and Eve sinned. They turned away from God. They followed Satan. But when we believe Jesus, he buys us back. We are his.

To whom will Jesus present us some day? \_\_\_\_\_

11. He will present us to God. He will present us without any spots.

Jude 24-25:

Now to him who is able . . . to present you without blemish before the presence of his glory with rejoicing, to the only God, our Savior through Jesus Christ our Lord, be glory, majesty, dominion, and authority.

Who will present the Christians to God? \_\_\_\_\_

12. Jesus will do this. We went away from God, but Jesus bought us back. Some day he will present us to God without any spots. Jesus has saved us.

He is able to keep us from falling. He makes us able to stand against temptation. He helps us not to sin.

Who tells us that Jesus is able to keep us from falling and to present us to God? \_\_\_\_\_

13. Jude tells us this. He ends his letter with this wonderful truth. He says that Jesus is able to keep us from falling.

What will Jesus do with us in the end? \_\_\_\_\_

14. Jesus will present us to God. Jude says we will be presented without spots. There will be no sin in our lives. Jesus forgives our sin and helps us overcome sin. He takes our sin away.

Jude also says we will be presented to God with rejoicing. Jesus will be full of joy too. We will be with God forever. Then we will never be tempted to sin again.

The second thing Jesus is able to do for us is to present us to God. What is the first thing? \_\_\_\_\_

15. Jesus is able to keep us from falling. By his help we can be faithful in following God.

What is the second thing Jesus is able to do for us?

16. He is able to present us to God. These are wonderful truths. Jude gives praise to Jesus for what he is able to do. As we end our study of seven letters, we too should give praise to Jesus.

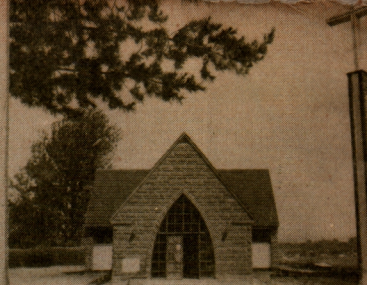
